



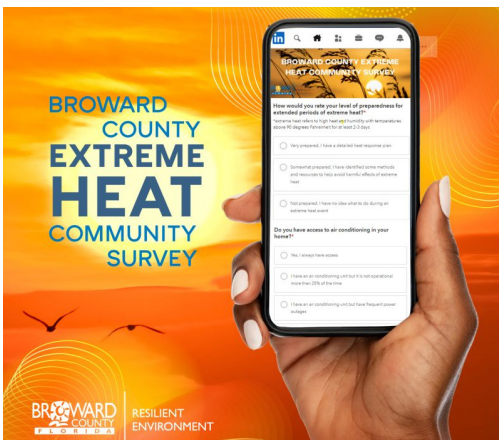

Traffic Calming: A comprehensive speed and traffic volume data collection effort has been completed for 65 locations throughout Boulevard Gardens, Roosevelt Gardens and Washington Park. County staff reviewed the data for roadway segments with documented speeding and higher-than-desired traffic volume levels. Using the data collected, initial efforts to calm traffic will focus on speed humps and speed tables in Washington Park, Boulevard Gardens and Roosevelt Gardens. Last month the Broward County Traffic Engineering Division sent letters to residents directly impacted to notify them of future speed humps installations and speed tables.

Additional traffic calming measures are still being considered such as intersection diverters and raised intersections as they may be more effective in both reducing speeds and limiting cut-through traffic. Moving forward, staff will seek input from the residents regarding these additional traffic calming measures.

Code Compliance

BMSD residents can benefit from Code Compliance services, which aim to maintain a safe and healthy community by ensuring compliance with local ordinances and regulations. The Code Compliance team provides services such as enforcing zoning regulations, property maintenance codes, and responding to citizen complaints about potential violations.

Code Compliance Inspectors work proactively to investigate complaints and violations related to unsightly buildings, overgrown vegetation, inoperable vehicles, illegal dumping, and other areas of concern. By collaborating with other county departments and neighborhood associations, the program strives to address community concerns and improve the quality of life for residents.

Residents are encouraged to do their part by reporting potential code violations by reporting on the MyBroward App, or calling the Broward County Call Center at 311, Monday thru Friday, 8:30 am to 5:30 pm, or by sending an email to codecomplaint@broward.org. Please be sure to provide your name, and address so the Code Compliance team can perform an investigation to determine whether a violation exists. If a violation is found, the responsible person(s) will be notified and given time to correct the issue. If the violation is not corrected, the issuance of fines or other steps to encourage compliance may be taken by a code inspector.
