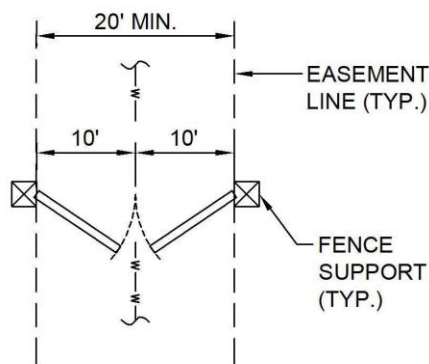

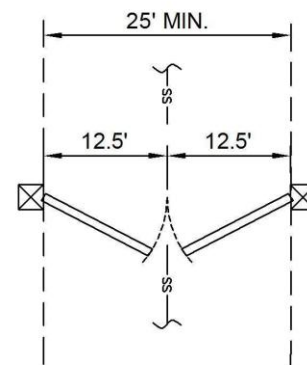

No technical changes were made to this document since its last issuance. The only change to this document since the last issuance was re-titling the document and formatting.

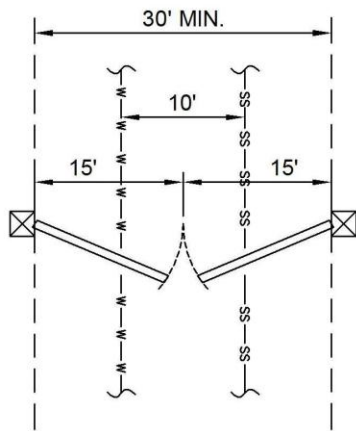
In no case shall a fence or wall be allowed to run inside and more or less parallel to a Water and Wastewater Services (WWS) easement. Chain link fences will be allowed to perpendicularly cross a WWS easement. Should a land owner request that a wall or fence other than chain link cross a WWS easement, a gate will be required according to the following standards:



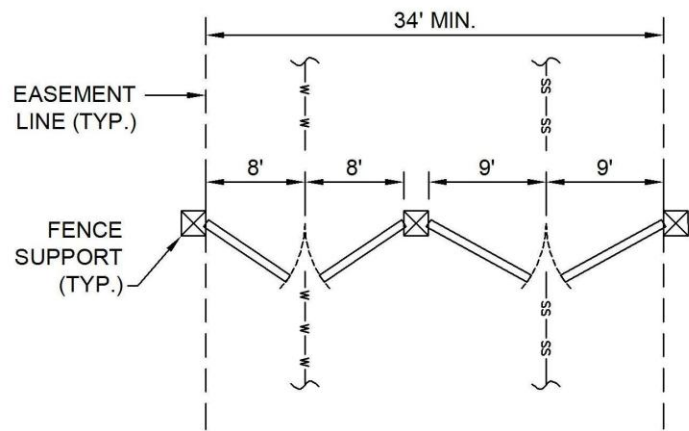
Pressure Pipe

Water and Wastewater (two pipes)

NOTES:

- 1) Sliding gates may be used in lieu of swinging gates.
- 2) Posts, columns, or other fence supports shall not encroach upon the provided easement.
- 3) Gates may be secured by the "chain and lock" method, WWS does not require a key.
