May passenger traffic recap

In May, FLL welcomed 2.8 million passengers, a 4.7 percent jump in traffic over the same month in 2021.

Domestic travelers (nearly 2.3 million) accounted for the bulk of visitation, a slight increase from May 2021. Meanwhile international passenger volume rebounded 31% from a year ago to 521,019 visitors.

Of note, only 10% fewer passengers traveled through FLL in May 2022 versus the same month in 2019.

Operation Nightingale is a Wrap!

Airport conducts third active shooter drill since 2018

The Broward County Aviation Department (BCAD) successfully completed a multi-layered full-scale active threat training exercise at FLL on Thursday, June 23, from 11PM until 3AM on Friday, June 24, with a variety of airport partners.

BCAD conducted the "<u>Operation Nightingale</u>" overnight drill mainly inside Terminal 1's Concourse A and a portion of the Rental Car Center. However, the complex training scenarios also involved staging police, fire rescue, and medical transport vehicles in exterior airport areas, including along the terminal curbside, airfield, and perimeter roadways

This FEMA-compliant mass-casualty exercise brought together over 500 volunteers and first responders to test emergency response and communications capabilities and build resiliency among local partners. Attending dignitaries included Broward County Mayor Michael Udine, County Administrator Monica Cepero, and Broward Sheriff Gregory Tony. Operation Nightingale was the third active assailant/active shooter training drill conducted by FLL in recent years. Two similar exercises took place in December 2019 and April 2018.



Norse Atlantic Airways' FLL Debut

Startup aims to be "The Explorer's Airline"

Norse Atlantic Airways <u>celebrated its first commercial departure service</u> from Fort Lauderdale to Oslo, Norway on June 20. Norse operated the full flight with its signature Boeing 787 Dreamliner fuel-efficient and eco-friendly aircraft, dubbed a "Longship," a name inspired by Nordic tradition.

To celebrate Norse's first FLL departure flight, the airport hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony at Gate G3 in Terminal 4 with special guests and dignitaries. The festivities included remarks by Norse CEO Bjorn Tore Larsen, Broward County Mayor Michael Udine, FLL CEO Mark Gale, and Visit Lauderdale's EVP, Tony Cordo.

During the celebrations, Mayor Udine proclaimed June 20 as Norse Atlantic Airways Appreciation Day and presented Larsen with the keys to Broward County.

Another "no-issues" HWO in the books

North Perry Airport (HWO), the general aviation reliever airport for FLL, passed its 2022 Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) inspection with "zero discrepancies." The annual inspection is required to maintain the airport's operating license. The evaluation process ensures that the primary surfaces and safety areas for all runways are clear of hazards and meet state regulations. This is HWO's 22nd consecutive year with no issues to correct on its yearly FDOT review.


