A Message From the CEO

Travel activity in March was in high gear as spring breakers, springtime vacationers, and business travelers traversed FLL's terminals to and from various domestic and international destinations. During the month, airlines operating at FLL had 370 scheduled daily departures, nearly 8% more than in March 2022, with many flights operating near or at full capacity. However, based on the airline seat capacity scheduled for March, FLL is forecasting nearly 3.6 million passengers for the month, up about 18% over March 2022, which nearly matches the number of visitors in March 2019.

If the appetite for travel remains strong, April should be busy, too, as consumers plan leisure, business trips or annual spring holiday getaways to visit far-off family and friends. As such, passenger traffic for April 2023 could hit 3.25 million travelers versus 2.85 million in April 2022 and 3.23 million visitors in April 2019.

During March, FLL successfully underwent its Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) annual comprehensive airport safety and regulatory inspection, which includes a review of airfield lighting, markings, and signage, passing it with no discrepancies or irregularities. Congratulations to the Broward County Aviation Department (BCAD) Airside Operations, Maintenance, Airport Development, Emergency Management teams, and Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) staff on a remarkable inspection outcome.

As the new leaves and pretty blossoms of spring sprout around us, let's pause to enjoy the cherished hallmarks of this season of renewal and rebirth.

Air Show Returns in April

Soaring through the skies

One of the most anticipated events in the South Florida area returns next month. The <u>Fort Lauderdale Air Show</u> flies into town April 29-30. The U.S. Navy Blue Angels and the F-22 Raptor Demo Team are double-headlining the show and will fly to and from FLL for their performances.

Kirby Chambliss, the Red Bull Air Force, and the SOCOM Para-Commandos are other acts expected to use FLL's runways during the show. This take-off and landing activity should not impact airport operations.

Additional performers announced to date include the T-38 Talon, Air Force Reserve F-16 Vipers, and aerobatic pilot Michael Goulian, with more expected to join the lineup.



New F&B for Terminal 3

Topo Chico bar, a new food court, and more

Concessionaire Delaware North is working on adding a new <u>Topo Chico</u> bar brand concept in Terminal 3, Concourse E, by the end of 2023. The colorful new beverage hangout offerings will include <u>mineral waters</u> and <u>hard seltzers</u>.

A new Food Court, slated to open in Concourse E by year-end, will feature popular brands such as Dunkin, Pollo Tropical, and Burger Fi. Watch for more updates on this new dining venue.

Additionally, a Bonefish Grill restaurant is in the works for Terminal 3 and could open by summertime to serve airport guests traveling to/from Concourses E and F.

FLL Terminal Tunes Resumes

Travelers can enjoy live music from local artists

The airport's Terminal Tunes program resumed on March 10 for the first time in almost three years. The free entertainment program, which offers live music performances in various locations across FLL, was suspended in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Initially launched in mid-2009, Terminal Tunes is a fun, engaging, and entertaining amenity for passengers and visitors to enjoy at the airport. Participating local entertainers can interact with a live audience and showcase their talents to the millions of people who travel through annually. In turn, the program is a way for FLL to support the local community by providing an international platform to promote their music.

March featured eight entertainers who performed pre-security throughout select airport terminals. Some musical genres included in the lineup were jazz, blues, and classic rock. The <u>schedule</u> is updated monthly with details of performers, locations, and times.

The Italian-manufactured plane has high-fuel efficiency and will lower fuel emissions of flight training by almost 70%, the company said.

ATW recognizes excellence in the air transport industry






