# A Message From the CEO

Unprecedented thunderstorms on April 12 turned much of our airport's airfields, roadways, and neighboring community streets into lakes overnight following record-breaking rainfall that accumulated in less than 24 hours.

The April Showers downpour was one for the history books. The stormy weather lingering over FLL relentlessly dumped nearly 26 inches of rainwater on the airport and surrounding areas, with 19 inches falling in just a six-hour period.

As the Broward County Aviation Department (BCAD) worked to combat this historic flooding event, many airport guests had to shelter in place, either at FLL or elsewhere in South Florida, as flights were grounded and the airport's roadways closed or impassable. It wasn't until early

flights were grounded and the airport's roadways closed or impassable. It wasn't until early Thursday morning that stranded guests and employees could leave the airport after weather and roadway conditions had improved.

Safety was paramount as our staff worked to assess the airfield conditions as the water receded, enabling us to understand the impact of the floodwaters and set a plan to restore partial or complete operations as soon as possible.

Special thanks to the BCAD teams and other airport personnel who came to our aid for working hard and steadfastly to get the airport operational after closing for a day and a half. Read more in the story below. While we celebrate the progress of restoring operations on FLL's two runways within a few days, there is still some ground to cover to fully repair the damage to areas of the North Runway.

Equally, it could be a long road back to normalcy for our community residents who suffered significant damage to their homes, businesses, or vehicles during this extraordinary flooding event. Our thoughts and prayers go out to everyone impacted, and we wish you a speedy recovery.

On the upside, despite the flooding's impact on airport operations, FLL expects to have served 3.16 million travelers in April, compared to 2.85 million passengers in the same month last year. That's just 2.2% shy of the 3.23 million visitors in April 2019.

### Touching down at FLL

The Fort Lauderdale <u>Air Show</u> flew into town for the last weekend of the month. During the April 29-30 event, some of the highly anticipated performers, such as the U.S. Navy Blue Angels and the F-22 Raptor Demo Team, used FLL's runways for training runs and trips to and from their scheduled acts.

Earlier in the week, on April 26, a media day was held at Jetscape at FLL, where the performers practiced pre-show flights and provided local reporters with a closer look at their head-turning aircraft.

Other performers that occupied FLL's runways were aerobatic pilot Kirby Chambliss, the Red Bull Air Force, and the SOCOM Para-Commandos.

### Others help in flood recovery efforts

Following the epic mid-April flooding in the Fort Lauderdale area that closed FLL for nearly two days, BCAD was fortunate to receive assistance from several airports during our reopening efforts.

In-person help came from a Savannah International Airport (SAV) team, who worked alongside FLL staff to reopen the flooded employee parking lot and assisted in clearing other impacted airport areas. The 10-member SAV team, comprised of electricians, airfield technicians, and other skilled staff, played an integral part in reopening the airport's employee parking lot.

FLL also received in-kind assistance from Florida airports that provided extra replacement parts to repair damaged electrical components enabling our airport to more quickly reopen and rebound from some of the flooding's impacts.

It was a herculean effort, but through great teamwork, collaboration, and tireless determination of everyone involved, FLL reopened at 9AM on April 14 with aircraft operations on the South Runway. At noon on April 15, daytime-only operations resumed on the North Runway, and by April 19, select nighttime aircraft activity returned to this runway.

More than 100 local youth from ages 8-14 participated in this year's activities. Along with engaging with JetBlue's women crewmembers, the girls toured an Airbus A320 aircraft.

According to JetBlue, Fly Like a Girl aims to promote interest in Science, Education, Technology, and Mathematics by showcasing career possibilities early on to inspire the next generation of aviators.

Honor Flight South Florida (HFSF), in partnership with Spirit Airlines and BCAD, hosted its 27<sup>th</sup> veterans' trip to Washington, D.C. from FLL on April 1. Sixty-nine U.S. veterans from the Korean War, Cold War, WWII, and Vietnam traveled to the nation's capital on the one-day trip to visit their respective war memorials.

Upon returning to FLL, the veterans were greeted by dozens of family members, friends, and supporters, thanking them for their honorable service. American flags, heartfelt signs, and joyful cheers filled Terminal 4. Currently, three more Honor Flight homecomings are planned for FLL this year on May 6, September 23, and October 28, according to HFSF's website.



### New store donates to local nonprofit






