A Message From the CEO

February was a busy month with exciting news for FLL from existing airlines and others planning to debut in 2023. We're sharing a recap of these important announcements in this newsletter. Read more about JetBlue Airways' growth plans for our airport, including new service to Florida's capital in 2024, a new international route coming from Israeli airline EL AL, and our new renewed transatlantic service to London, England, courtesy of Norse Atlantic Airways.

Besides this trio of breaking destination news, FLL welcomed two new nonstop routes from Avelo Airlines in February: Wilmington, DE, and Raleigh-Durham, NC. Delaware's Wilmington Airport is a welcomed addition to our airport's nonstop travel options to cities along the Northeastern U.S. corridor and is a first-time nonstop destination for FLL. The Raleigh-Durham region of North Carolina is known for its research, technology, and

educational institutions. This new four-times weekly route should help to increase business synergies and leisure travel demand between our two regions.

As is customary in February, FLL showed some extra love to its guests on St. Valentine's Day with a small token of appreciation for their support in the form of roses made of chocolate to sweeten their journey.

Looking back at January, FLL served 3.03 million passengers, a 34% increase from the same month in 2022. Domestic passenger traffic grew 27% to 2.32 million travelers from a year ago, and international visitation rose 65% to 709.133. Compared to pre-pandemic activity, January's passenger volume was only 6.2% less than the same month in 2019.

Looking forward, we are optimistic about what March has in store for FLL as the end of the first quarter of 2023 nears.

JetBlue Talks FLL Growth

Readying for a major take-off by 2027

On February 15, JetBlue Airways outlined its plans to grow its operations at Broward County's FLL as part of its proposed merger with Spirit Airlines, pending regulatory approval.

The airline's FLL growth prospectus includes increasing its focus city operations to more than 250 daily flights by 2027, starting with a new nonstop service to Florida's capital city Tallahassee in January 2024. Additionally, the carrier pledged to build a new maintenance hangar facility at FLL and support key Master Plan and improvement projects.

FLL welcomes first-ever Tel Aviv service

Also, on February 15, EL AL Israel Airlines announced plans to expand operations in South Florida with new nonstop seasonal service between FLL and Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport (TLV) starting September 13.

The Israeli national airline would begin flying year-round between Fort Lauderdale and Tel Aviv in the Spring of 2024. The initial seasonal service will operate on select days of the week to accommodate passenger demand through October during the Jewish High Holidays season.

Norse Adds London Route

Big Ben, here we come

On February 14, our Norwegian airline partnerNorse Atlantic Airways launched ticket sales for its latest transatlantic destination from FLL to London, England. Starting May 26, Norse plans to operate three weekly flights between Fort Lauderdale and London Gatwick Airport (LGW) with its eco-friendly Boeing 787 Dreamliner aircraft that offers economy and premium-class cabin in-flight experiences.

Norse added nonstop service between FLL and Berlin, Germany, in early December, just a few months after commencing its inaugural route to Oslo, Norway, in June 2022.

Challenge Air at FXE




Tailgating BCAD-style
