A Message From the CEO

Dear Friends,

Welcome to NewsFLLash Issue No. 40 of FLL's official monthly newsletter. For those who celebrated Halloween, we hope it was a safe and fun time with family and friends. With fall ramping up and cooler weather starting to arrive in South Florida, we're looking forward to preparing the airport's terminals for the upcoming year-end holiday season that begins with Thanksgiving Day.

In early October, the Broward County Aviation
Department (BCAD) officially broke ground on FLL's
new Terminal 5 project. The domestic, five-gate facility
will include new retail, food, and beverage
concessions, among other guest amenities and
services.

During the month, BCAD received news that FLL had again received Global Biorisk Advisory Council (GBAC) STAR Facility accreditation. This recognition, <u>first attained in 2022</u>, signifies that FLL has implemented the most stringent protocols for cleaning, disinfection, and infectious disease prevention in its facilities under the guidance of GBAC, a division of the worldwide cleaning industry association ISSA.

On October 28, BCAD hosted another Honor Flight South Florida, "Operation Homecoming," event to recognize and celebrate the invaluable service of 70 U.S. veterans to this country. It was FLL's third and last Honor Flight homecoming event for 2023, and we expect to host more in 2024.

As November kicks off, the Aviation Department is looking forward to welcoming FLL's third new carrier this year, Porter Airlines, following the September debut of EL AL and BermudAir. The Canadian carrier will begin nonstop service to Toronto and Ottawa at month-end, operated with its eco-friendly, single-aisle, 132-seat Embraer E195-E2 aircraft. Additionally, new domestic and international routes from existing carriers, Allegiant and Bahamasair, are set to launch in mid-November. Read more about these new flights below.

Let's remember we're in the final stretch of the Atlantic hurricane season, and we hope that the remaining weeks until November 30 will be relatively quiet, if not storm-free.

Here are some tips for those planning to fly through FLL for Thanksgiving gatherings this year.

Arrive Early: Typically, travelers are advised to arrive at least two hours before a domestic flight and three hours if flying internationally. However, during peak holiday periods, it's best to follow any updated guidance from your airline, as more time may be required for check-in/bag processing. Security processing may also take longer due to increased passenger activity.

Onsite Parking: With the ongoing high demand for <u>curbside valet</u> <u>service and self-parking</u> options at FLL this year, especially during the holidays, we recommend getting dropped off by family, friends, or a ride-share service instead (Uber, Lyft, etc.) as our onsite garages are likely to be sold out.

Travel & Guns: If you plan to travel with a licensed firearm, follow the <u>Transportation Security Administration (TSA) protocols</u> to safely pack and transport your weapon as checked luggage. If caught with a gun at a TSA passenger screening checkpoint, this will disrupt your travel plans, and you could face a hefty penalty and an arrest.


New Routes on the Horizon

More domestic and international flights

Bahamasair will begin its brand-new nonstop service to George Town, Exuma, on November 15. The flagship carrier of The Bahamas will operate with two flights weekly connecting FLL to Exuma International Airport.

<u>Allegiant Air</u> will offer nonstop routes between FLL and Nashville, Tenn., starting on November 16, and Cedar Rapids, Iowa on November 17.

New FLL carrier, <u>Porter Airlines</u>, begins service with daily flights from Toronto Pearson International Airport and Ottawa International Airport on November 30.

Operation Convergent Drill

Testing FLL's emergency preparedness

On October 12, FLL held its triennial full-scale exercise, "Operation Convergent," to test the airport's response and preparedness. The drill involved a scenario of a collision between two commercial aircraft with over 150 passengers and crew combined. Multiple volunteers from the airport and surrounding communities participated, as well as numerous local, state, and federal agencies.









Groundbreaking for Terminal 5

Completion targeted for mid-2026

A major milestone in FLL history was celebrated on October 9 with the groundbreaking ceremony for the airport's new <u>Terminal 5</u> (T5). This \$404 million, two-level, five-gate domestic facility is the airport's first ground-up construction of a new terminal in decades. T5 will feature check-in/ticketing, baggage processing, security screening, food and beverage, retail venues, and a pedestrian bridge or connector walkway to Terminal 4 and the Cypress Garage.

Some special guests and VIPs joining BCAD to celebrate the groundbreaking included Lt. Governor of Florida Jeanette Nuñez, Florida Department of Transportation Secretary Jared W. Perdue, Broward County Administrator Monica Cepero, Broward County Mayor Lamar P. Fisher, and JetBlue President/COO Joanna Geraghty. Additionally, U.S. Representative Debbie Wasserman-Schultz offered a video greeting during the celebration, and FLL CEO/Director of Aviation Mark Gale served as the master of ceremonies. The new state-of-the-art and environmentally friendly terminal is targeted for a mid-2026 completion.









FITCE Turns Eight

FLL attends global trade and cultural event

The 8th Annual Florida International Trade and Cultural Expo (FITCE) was held in Fort Lauderdale October 4-5. FLL CEO/Director of Aviation Mark Gale, Broward County Mayor Lamar P. 


Sandwich in the Sky

Subway flies into town




