

5.D PUBLIC PROPERTIES/HISTORIC RESOURCES

Public properties, which can include historic resources, fall under several different designations and are managed by various Federal, state, and local agencies. They can include publicly-owned and used parks, recreational areas, wildlife and waterfowl refuges, national and state forests, wilderness areas, or an historic site of national, state, or local significance. Public lands and historic resources are protected for the conservation of natural resources, the protection of historic sites, and the provision of outdoor recreational opportunities. Most public lands are protected to provide for public enjoyment in such a way that will leave resources unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations. This section describes public properties/historic resources in the EIS Study Area that surround the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport (FLL).
