

6.D. PUBLIC PROPERTIES/HISTORIC RESOURCES

Public properties in the U.S. fall under several different designations and are managed by various Federal, state, and local lead agencies. They include publicly owned and used parks, recreational areas, wildlife and waterfowl refuges, national and state forests, wilderness areas, or an historic site of national, state, or local significance. Public lands are protected for the conservation of natural resources, the protection of historic sites, and the provision of outdoor recreational opportunities. Most public lands are protected to provide for public enjoyment in such a way that will leave resources unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations. This section describes impacts to public properties/historic resources in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) Study Area that surrounds the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport (FLL).
