Presentation

Jeff Halsey, Director, Environmental/Consumer Protection Department (ECPD) presented proposed changes to Chapter 3½ ordinance to accommodate relocation of Medical Transport Services to ECPD.

ECPD functions include licensing, inspecting, and enforcing regulations. ECPD in the long term wants a process of creating one enforcement strategy to deal with problems.

Recommendations include:

- Eliminate EMS Council recommendations for new Class 5.
- Instead of EMS Council recommending, have interaction at meetings between Rick Sluman, ECPD, and the EMS Council
- Not going to the Board for certificate approval
- New certificates approved by ECPD
- All renewals by ECPD
- Enforcement to go through hearing officer for consistency across board
- Hearing officer can give warnings and citations/fines
- Enforcement is for all class applications
- Enforcement is whatever falls under ECPD's regulatory authority
- Administrative review by public. If public has issues go through hearing officer to make case on ECPD actions/decisions
- Instead of EMS Council, ECPD hearing officer can suspend, revoke or modify application

- Enforcement program is in place to verify compliance
- Having regulations at a local level

Discussion by the EMS Council and ECPD. Concerns and issues by EMS Council were expressed.

Dr. C. Mallak said he believes the application should come back to the EMS Council, with its experts, to address issues and risks to the public. Mr. J. Halsey said they could do it like that for a time and see. Currently, EMS Council is actively involved in recommendations mainly in new and renewal of Class 5 applications.

As a result of the feedback from the EMS Council, ECPD will consider their next steps to the proposed changes to the ordinance.

ECPD still has to meet with the fire chiefs, February 7, on this ordinance proposal.
