The Governance Subcommittee will meet to discuss the identified topics listed below and encourage the public to attend, listen, and provide perspective to the Governance Subcommittee as they continue to review the Charter.

At the Charter Review Commission's March 12, 2016 workshop and special meeting, the Governance Subcommittee was established and is now comprised of 12 members. Since its inception, the Governance Subcommittee has identified and engaged in discussions on the following topics:

- Elected Mayor
- County Commission Makeup
- Redistricting
- Term Limits
- County Commission Committees (Committees of the Commission)
- County Administration
- County Auditor
- Constitutional Officers

These discussion topics serve as basis for the Governance Subcommittee's review, deliberation, and possible formulation of recommendations through the remainder of the Charter Review Commission's term.

About the Broward County Charter Review:

The Broward County Charter serves as the Constitution for Broward County Government. It was originally adopted in 1974, and provides for the appointment of a Charter Review Commission every 12 years. The Charter Review Commission is authorized and empowered to conduct a comprehensive study of any or all phases of county government, including significant, regional, long-term and complex issues facing Broward County. Recommendations of the Charter Review Commission will help determine the design of Broward County government, and how it should function to best meet the needs of its residents. Recommendations must be voted on by the electorate to amend the Broward County Charter.
