



LIVE/WORK ARTSPACE

Artspace Projects, Inc., a Minneapolis-based not-for-profit real estate developer for the arts, is working with Broward County toward the development of artists live/work spaces. The West Side School site in Sailboat Bend will have two components: the adaptive re-use of the historic West Side School into a new home for the Broward County Historical Commission and construction of a new building that will provide live/work space for 37 artists and their families. Plans are also in the works for a Hollywood site for an artist live/work space project.



ARTSPARKS

The County has invested \$15 million to create “hands-on” centers for arts and culture through the ArtsPark Project. Four cities (Pembroke Pines, Miramar, Hollywood, and Lauderhill) have provided \$40.6 million in matching funds, bringing the total to \$55.6 million.



In February 2004, public artist Ritsuko Taho visited the Hollywood ArtsPark site for the groundbreaking event *Leap Into the Future*. Taho presented her designs for the ArtsPark which featured a spectacular, artist-designed fountain expected to be approximately 125 feet in length and 40 feet wide with 100 water jets shooting more than 20 feet in the air; beds of seasonal flowers and flowering trees, promenades; cultural facilities and children’s play areas.
