The Cultural Division's grants team had an exciting year with new ideas, outstanding speakers, and capacity building programs. Through a series of workshops and seminars, they continue to guide applicants through the processes of gaining access to \$4 million in funds distributed through 10 grant programs that facilitate more than 100 grants and artist fellowships.

Additionally, there were some exciting new ventures. The new *Cultural Diversity Forums* targeted diverse artists throughout Broward County. Four sessions were held, attracting more than 100 artists, in a round-table forum that encouraged open dialogue. Forums were held at African-American Research Library and Cultural Center; Minority Development & Empowerment; Hispanic Unity, and the Coral Springs Chinese Cultural Center.

Innovative workshops were facilitated including: a *Program Evaluation* workshop; *New Business Ventures for Not-for-Profit Organizations*; *From Mission to Motivation: A Focused Approach to Increased Arts Participation*, and the internationally renowned speaker Carol Coletta was invited to speak in a ground-breaking workshop entitled *Creative Cities and Creative Communities*.

The Broward artists, who were this year's winners of the annual South Florida Cultural Consortium, were Felipe Aguirre (\$7,500) Colby Katz (\$15,000), Kimberley Maxwell (\$7,500) and W.W. Weaver (\$15,000), in this award program designed to assist visual and media artists through cash disbursements solely on the basis of creative excellence to foster artistic development and encourage career advancement. The South Florida Cultural Consortium is an alliance of the local arts agencies of Martin, Palm Beach, Broward, Miami-Dade and Monroe counties. The Cultural Division is a facilitator of these awards.
