Public Art and Design

Project Comments

- The Broward County Public Art and Design ordinance was established to enhance community aesthetics, promote economic development, and boost tourism. The ordinance instituted a requirement for contributions for art funding based on a percentage of eligible cost components for eligible capital projects.
- The specific percentages of public art allocations are as follows: Two percent of the eligible County Capital Projects, which includes any capital improvement project paid for wholly or in part by funds appropriated by Broward County, to construct or renovate any park, road beautification, bridge or causeway, beach restoration, sidewalk, bikeway, above grade utility, land acquisition for greenways, and to construct or renovate any building except detention facilities. Appropriations for highway and arterial road projects, less projects in the unincorporated areas, shall include an amount equal to one percent (1%) of the total eligible construction costs. Eligible construction costs means the total capital project appropriation, including engineering and design, less demolition costs, equipment costs, real property acquisition costs and soil remediation costs.
- The public art allocation includes commissioned works of art that create a sense of place, that improve the visual environment for the citizens of Broward County and that advance the missions of the County departments where the projects reside. Commissioned artworks are the result of interaction between selected artists and interested constituent groups during the design stages of the projects.
- Non-bond and non-enterprise program art funds are transferred to the Public Art Trust for allocation; bond, grant and enterprise appropriations remain within their respective funds. All public art and design projects in the County are included in an annual plan recommended by the Broward Cultural Council and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.
- Fiscal year 2009 projects include the South Florida Cultural Consortium artworks (up to \$20,000).
- The public art and design allocations for the following projects will be established later in the process: Supervisor of Elections Building, Ten Court Room Expansion, North Regional Courthouse Parking Deck, Courthouse Tower Design, Downtown Judicial Complex Master Plan, Aviation Terminal 4 and the Convention Center Hotel.
- In fiscal year 2009 a mid-year allocation was made for Terminal 18 at Port Everglades in the amount of \$748,000.
- Two full-time positions for the Parks and Land Preservation Bond concluded in fiscal year 2008.
- The fiscal year 2009 conservation and program support allocation includes a \$350,000 agreement with Nova Southeastern University on behalf of their Museum of Art Division.
- To complete projects, additional contractual services will be added to the agreement with Nova Southeastern University on behalf of their Museum of Art Division from the Parks and Land Bond Preservation Fund.

- Conservation projects shall include "Calypso" by Tobey Archer at Port Terminal 2 (\$9,900). "Envelope Series" by Miles Batt and "Colors and Forms in Flights" by Dorothy Gillespie at Airport Terminal 3 (\$8,500). "Home of the Brave: by Beryl Solla, at Booher Addiction Recovery Center (\$5,100).
- Public Art allocations for the following projects are budgeted in various capital funds for FY 2009.
