

MECHANICAL INSPECTOR (486-06)

SALARY: \$46,196.80 - \$60,507.20 annually, plus liberal fringe benefits

The pay for Mechanical Inspectors is based on their possession of the State of Florida Building Code Administrators and Inspectors Board certificate.

THE POSITION

This is inspectional work of average difficulty in securing compliance with City ordinances and the Florida Building Code, and accepted standards governing the installation and operation of mechanical systems and equipment.

An employee in this class is responsible for the inspection of a variety of mechanical installations, primarily those involving air conditioning, ventilation and refrigeration systems, so as to assure the standards of quality, material, workmanship and safety as established by City ordinances and the South Florida Building Code. Employees normally work independently on field inspections, making decisions requiring the use of technical judgment and discretion; however, they may consult with a higher-ranking inspector on the more difficult or unusual cases.

NOTE: The duties of this position will include all of those duties set forth in the official job description.

THE REQUIREMENTS

1. Have graduated from a standard high school or vocational school or possess a G.E.D. certificate from a recognized issuing agency.
2. Have at least five (5) years supervisory construction experience in the mechanical field.
3. Possess a current Certificate of Competency as a Mechanical Contractor or Class "A" air conditioning contractor issued by an agency approved by the Broward County Board of Rules and Appeals.
PLEASE ATTACH COPY OF CERTIFICATE TO APPLICATION.
4. Be eligible to obtain certification as a Mechanical Inspector from Broward County Board of Rules and Appeals.
5. Possess or be eligible to obtain a Florida driver's license.

NOTE: Required certifications/licenses must be kept current to continue employment in this class.

THE EXAMINATION

Depending on the number of applicants and the quality of their education and experience, the examination may consist of one or more of the following tests: Evaluation of Training and Experience, Oral Interview, Written Examination, or other assessment method. Applicants must attain a minimum score of 70 in each part of the examination in order to qualify. All successful applicants will be required to pass a medical examination, including drug screening, prior to appointment.

HOW TO APPLY

Application forms should be filled out completely and should clearly show that the minimum qualifications are met. Eligibility for hire may be based on a rating of the application; therefore, completeness and accuracy are of the utmost importance. Official City of Fort Lauderdale applications will be accepted and received at the Department of Human Resources, City Hall, 100 North Andrews Avenue – 3rd Floor, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, **open continuously until sufficient applications have been received.**
