### **Broward County Commissioner Ilene Lieberman to Serve as First Vice President of the Florida Association of Counties**

Broward County Commissioner Ilene Lieberman was recently elected by her peers from throughout the state to serve as first vice president of the Florida Association of Counties (FAC). She had previously served as the 2<sup>nd</sup> vice president of FAC.

“Participation in the Florida Association of Counties benefits Broward County and other large urban counties by giving us greater access to state leaders and influence in shaping government policy,” said Commissioner Lieberman.

The association is governed by a board of directors, comprised of one county commissioner from each state senate district, five executive officers, six county commissioners appointed at large and past association presidents. The executive officers of the FAC are President, President-Elect, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, and the Immediate Past President. This Executive Committee conducts the business of the Association between board meetings (4 to 6 times a year).



Commissioner Lieberman is also a member of the National Association of Counties (NACo) board of directors and vice-chair of the NACo large urban county caucus steering committee.

The National Association of Counties (NACo) is the only national organization that represents county governments in the United States. Founded in 1935, NACo provides essential services to the nation's 3,066 counties. NACo advances issues with a unified voice before the federal government, improves the public's understanding of county government, assists counties in finding and sharing innovative solutions through education and research, and

provides value-added services to save counties and taxpayers money. NA Co's membership totals more than 2,000 counties, representing over 80 percent of the nation's population.
