Broward County Commissioner Sue Gunzburger Named “Living Legend” At 5th Annual Women’s Power Caucus

Broward County Commissioner Sue Gunzburger will be recognized as a “Living Legend” at the 5th Annual Women’s Power Caucus (WPC) on August 25, 2007 at Hyatt Pier 66, 2301 SE 17th Street Causeway in Fort Lauderdale. The awards luncheon will begin at noon. The event is sponsored by IN FOCUS Magazine and Office Depot.

“It has been a privilege to serve the public as an elected official for 25 years. I have been a County Commissioner for 15 years, the longest serving woman on the Commission,” said Commissioner Gunzburger. “I guess that qualifies me as a ‘Living Legend.’ Time goes by quickly when you enjoy what you do and accomplish the goals that you set for yourself. I’m honored to receive this award.”

The “Living Legend” Award recognizes women achievers with more than two-decades of civic or business accomplishments who have exhibited extraordinary leadership and service in the South Florida region.

Sue Gunzburger was first elected to the Broward County Commission in November 1992 by a landslide margin, running on a promise to empower the neighborhoods, protect the environment and clean-up county government. She was easily re-elected in 1994 and 1998. Before her election to the County Commission, Sue served as a Hollywood City Commissioner for ten years (1982-1992). She has also worked as a public school classroom teacher, a small businesswoman and a clinical marriage & family counselor.

“It is an honor for us to recognize Commissioner Gunzburger,” said Woodie Lesesne, President of IN FOCUS Magazine. “She has done so much for the community and has brought even more value to the Women’s Power Caucus this year.”
