“What Does College Have to Offer Me?” will be held at the Lauderhill Mall Branch Library on Wednesday, November 18 from 6 to 8 p.m. This program will help students and parents find the college that fits their financial and academic needs. The agenda will include a discussion of admission policies and requirements, local scholarships and their availability, and how to prepare in advance for college acceptance and admission.
