**Gay and Lesbian Literary Program: Queer Literature**

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – *Queer Literature: Where the Gay and Lesbian Literature Movement is Headed*, will be held on Thursday, June 14<sup>th</sup> from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., in the Main Boardroom, 8<sup>th</sup> Floor. This is the final program in a three-part series of *discussions on queer literature, with Mauro A. Montoya*, President of Lavender Writes.

Queer Literature, the three-part discussion series, has focused on the evolution of gay, lesbian, transgender and bisexual voices and their impact on mainstream notions of sex, sexuality, and the concept of gender in the Western world.

The Gay and Lesbian Literary Program Series has been presented since April at the Broward County Main Library, 100 S. Andrews Ave., Fort Lauderdale, and ArtServe, 1350 E. Sunrise Blvd., Fort Lauderdale.

The free events are presented by Broward County Library, Stonewall Library & Archives, the Broward Public Library Foundation, and the Community Foundation of Broward County and its partners.
