Broward County Library Book Clubs Bring Readers Together

From short stories and literary classics to “knit lit” and romance, book clubs at Broward County Library offer something for every reader

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – Love to read? Want to talk about it? Broward County Library now has over 25 regularly scheduled monthly Book Clubs at library locations countywide. This month the book clubs, which are free and open to the public, explore a wide range of fiction and nonfiction titles including works from Gen X and Y writers, poetry, works in Spanish, and more.

Book clubs celebrate reading, and give book lovers a place to meet like-minded people and talk about what they've read. This exchange of ideas, the freedom to share the literary experience with others – this is one of the true joys of a library.

During April, Broward County Library offers something for almost everyone, from readers of romantic fiction to short story aficionados to lovers of classic literature. Additionally, Broward County Library holds book club meetings at a range of times throughout the day – from midmorning to lunch hour to after-work evening sessions – that make it easy for anyone to attend regardless of their schedule.

Special series' include the Ruth E. Cohan Jewish Book Review, held in different locations countywide; Weston Branch's Spanish Book Club; the Beach Reader's Club; and the African-American Research Library and Cultural Center's Sankofa Book Club. During Tamarac Branch's "My Best Reads" discussion group, individuals are encouraged to bring their lunch and join in a discussion of their favorite books, fiction or nonfiction. Additionally, since April is National Poetry Month, a number of groups will be devoted to the reading and discussion of poetry, even encouraging members to bring their own works to read and share.
