BROWARD COUNTY, FL – Calling all fans of Anime (Japanese animation) and Manga (Japanese graphic novels) with skills in drawing and painting! The art must be in the form of original 2-D drawings (rated G or PG), sized 8½ x 11 or larger, matted or framed. Each piece must be accompanied with its own registration form (signed by an adult) and received by December 17, 2007. Entries will be accepted by mail or in person at Broward County Main Library, 100 S. Andrews Ave., Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301.

Selected entries will be displayed in the Main Library during the second annual Anime Convention. Last year's event attracted more than 2,000 teens and young adults for a day of colorful programs, events and attractions.
