**Broward County Commission Libraries Division Presents  
Sun-Sentinel Travel Editor Tom Swick  
at the Main Library on October 6 at 2 p.m.**

BROWARD COUNTY, FL - Tom Swick, travel editor of the *South Florida Sun-Sentinel*, will speak at the Main Library, 100 S. Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, on Saturday, October 6, at 2 p.m. Mr. Swick will discuss his book, *A Way To See The World*, a collection of stories about uncommon places he has traveled. Readers will visit more than 20 unique destinations including a hobo convention in Iowa, Mardi Gras in Mobile, Alabama; the last leg of the Oregon Trail; a tennis tournament in Miami; and one of the final baseball games played at Chicago's old Comiskey Park. Half the stories are set in the United States, half of the stories come from other countries. The book also examines the meaning of travel, and celebrates its beauty at a time when many are questioning its importance.

Mr. Swick's books will be available for sale and signing. Refreshments will be sponsored by the Friends of the Fort Lauderdale Libraries. The program will be held in the Bienes Museum of the Modern Book Conference Room on the sixth floor. For more information, call 954-357-7443.
