**Celebrating Our Communities Month in May**

BROWARD COUNTY, FL – On Saturday afternoons in May from 2 to 4:30 p.m., come visit *Bollywood* at the Weston Branch Library, 4205 Bonaventure Blvd. Why Bollywood? May is “Celebrating Our Communities Month,” and one of the communities surrounding the Weston Branch Library is an Indian population.

India’s film industry (known as “Bollywood”) is the most prolific in the world, churning out over a thousand movies every year. These films are famous for their sweeping stories and colorful song-and-dance numbers. Experience the comedy and drama, the singing and dancing that make these Bollywood movies so entertaining.

**May 3** - 2 to 4:30pm. *Hum Tum* is a romantic comedy about a young man and woman from Delhi who meet on a flight to New York, but after a disagreement, go their separate ways. Over the course of several years, they continue to bump into each other. Will they ever realize they're in love with each other?

**May 10** - 2 to 4:30pm. *Bunty aur Babli* is a romantic comedy/drama about two small-town dreamers who attempt to get funding to go to Bombay and realize their dreams. As they transform into the scheming criminal duo known as Bunty and Babli, things skyrocket as they are pursued across India by a police officer intent on stopping their crime wave.

**May 17** - 2 to 4:30pm. *Mujhse Dosti Karoge!* translates as “Let’s Be Friends!” and involves a love triangle among childhood friends. Raj is in love with Tina and has asked her to marry him because he thinks she’s the one who’s been e-mailing him for the last 10 years, but turns out it’s unassuming Pooja who was his pen pal. Turmoil arises when Raj learns the truth.

**May 31** - 2 to 4:30pm. *Salaam Namaste* follows the relationship between radio disc jockey Ambar and chef Nick, who unwittingly fall for each other after she criticizes him on her show. They try to make their contentious relationship work by living together but in separate rooms to see if they are compatible in any way.
