Fun words for you from the Mangrove Estuary

Brackish: Describes water that contains some salt.

Carapace: The part of a crab or turtle's shell covering the head and body.

Claw: A pincher on the leg of a crab or lobster.

Consumer: An animal that eats other animals or plants because they cannot make their own food.

Crustacean: Animals with an exoskeleton and jointed legs, like crabs, shrimp, and lobsters.

Decay: To rot or break down into the original pieces.

Decomposition: The process of rotting, it breaks down into the original pieces.

Detritus: Loose pieces of rotting plants or animals.

Estuary: An arm of the ocean that extends inland, usually where a river meets the ocean and the fresh water and salt water mix.

Exotic: From another part of the world.

Exoskeleton: The outer shell of insects and crustaceans.

Fiddle: A musical instrument like a violin.

Fins: The thin part on the outside of a fish's body that helps it swim and steer.

Indigenous: Living naturally in a place.

Invertebrate: An animal that does not have a backbone.

Juvenile: An animal that is not yet an adult.

Leaf: The usually green flat part of a plant used for making food.

Mangrove: Tropical trees living in tidal brackish water.

Mollusk: Animals with smooth bodies and a hard shell like snails and clams.

Mud: Wet soil.

Native: Indigenous, living naturally in a place.

Nectar: The sweet liquid produced by flowers to attract insects.

Plankton: Tiny plants and animals living and floating in water.

Predator: An animal that hunts and feeds on other animals.

Producer: A living thing that can produce its own food, plants.

Propagule: A seed that sprouts before leaving the parent plant.

Salinity: The total amount of dissolved salts in water.

Sand: Small, loose pieces of broken rock.

Scavenger: An animal that feeds on dead animals or other decaying plants and animals.

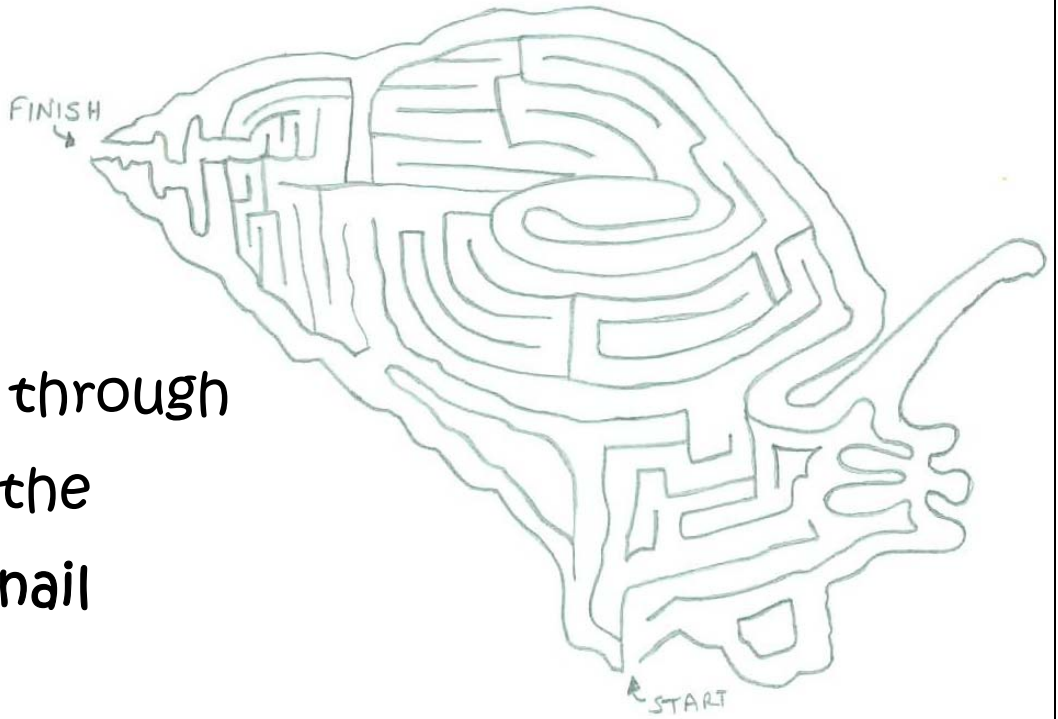
Shell: The hard outer covering of some animals.

Snag: A dead tree that is still standing.

Tidal Pool: A small body of water that is created by the tide.

Tides: The change in depth of ocean water near the coast because of the orbit of the moon.

Vertebrate: An animal with a backbone.
