

## Economic Characteristics - Labor Force and Employment

### Broward County Today ....

- 63% of Broward County's population over 16 years of age is in the labor force.
- Of the 801,772 in the labor force, 95% were employed in 2000 while 5% are unemployed.
- 80% of workers drive to work alone in their car. 12% carpool to work and 2% use public transportation.

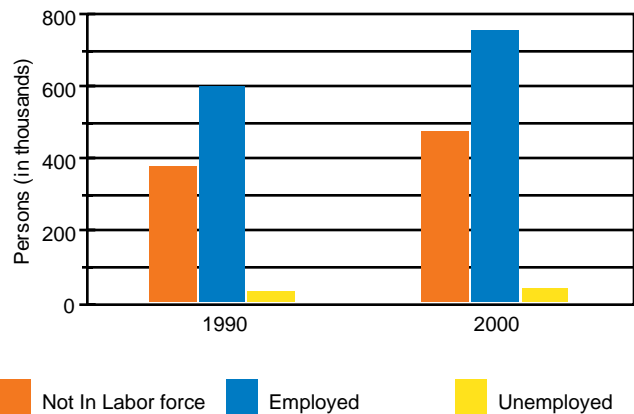

### Key Trends 1990 to 2000 ....

- Labor force participation rate remained constant at 63%.
- The number of persons working from home almost doubled in 10 years representing 3% of all employment.
- Mean travel time to work increased by four minutes from 23 to 27 minutes.

### Future Projections...

- As the baby boom population ages, the workforce population will decrease.
- Employment is projected to increase in the future but Broward will remain a net exporter of labor (more working residents in Broward than jobs available).

## Economic Characteristics - Occupation & Industry

### Broward County Today ....

- One third of Broward County residents are managers, professionals, while 31% are in sales and office occupations.
- 16% of residents work in service occupations.
- Almost half of all County residents work in the service industry.
- One quarter of Broward's residents work outside the county.

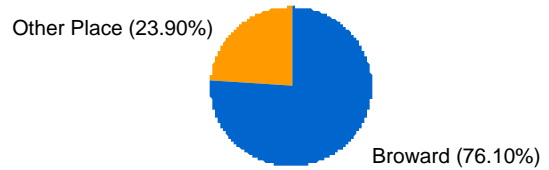
### Key Trends 1990 to 2000 ....

- Management, professional and related occupations increased from 26% to 33% in 2000.
- Sales and office occupations dropped from 36% to 31%.
- The agriculture & mining industry lost employment over the ten year period decreasing by 7,615.

### Future Projections...

- Farming, fishing and forestry will continue to decline as the amount of agricultural land decreases.
- The tourism-based economy will continue to provide service-sector jobs.

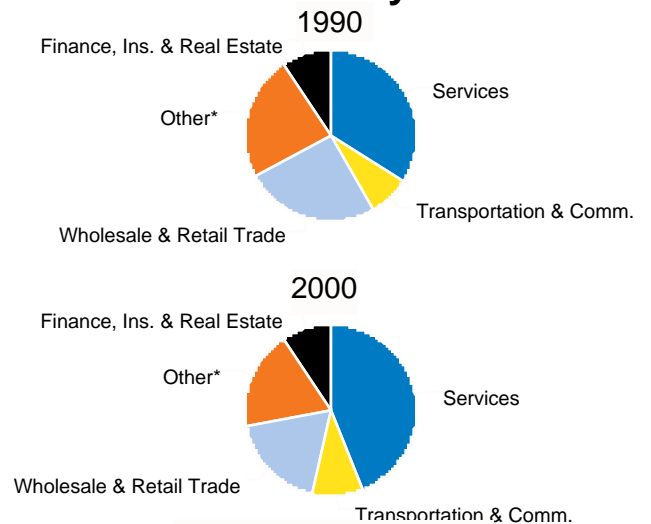

## Economic Characteristics - Education

### Broward County Today ....

- Grades 1 through 5 comprise 36% of all school enrollment.
- The majority of students (85%) attend public school.
- 82% of the population 25 years or older has a high school diploma. One in four has a bachelor's degree.

### Key Trends ....

- Enrollment in middle school (grades 6-8) increased by 26,760 between 1992/3 and 2001/2.
- 11,378 students are enrolled in charter schools in 2001/2.
- The percentage of the population have a high school diploma rose from 77% to 82%.
