SECURITY DEPOSIT REQUIREMENTS

Security deposits can be in the form of:

- 1) a cash deposit,
- 2) a payment bond with a surety licensed to do business in the State of Florida,
- 3) an irrevocable letter of credit,
- 4) an escrow agreement with a Florida financial institution or other acceptable escrow agent, or
- 5) a certificate of deposit.

Accounts will not be opened until a security deposit is received. Security deposits must equal the expected usage for a 45-day period. Accounts with charges exceeding the security deposit are placed on a cash basis until the overcharge is satisfied. Security deposit requirement is waived for governmental agencies.

After your security deposit and insurance certificate (if using waste-to-energy plants) have been approved, an account number and vehicle identification decals will be issued to your company.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

For use of Waste-to-Energy (Wheelabrator) Plants

Haulers shall maintain at their sole cost and expense general liability insurance and automobile liability insurance in the minimum amount of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) per occurrence, combined single limit bodily injury and property liability. Private haulers shall also maintain at their sole cost and expense worker's compensation insurance in the form and amounts required by Chapter 440, Florida Statutes. Liability policies shall name **Broward County, Florida, and its Board of County Commissioners, officials and employees** as additional insured and shall state that they can not be canceled or restricted without first giving thirty (30) days prior written notice in writing to the Office of Integrated Waste Management (OIWM). **Private haulers shall provide OIWM with evidence of such insurance coverage when applying for a charge account.** Private haulers shall provide OIWM with an updated insurance certificate with the additional named parties and cancellation clause within 30 days after making application for a charge account and on an annual basis thereafter.

Government agencies may provide proof of self-insurance to fulfill the insurance requirement.

LANDFILL USE ONLY CUSTOMERS

Insurance is not required for landfill-only customers.
