There are more than 1.7 million reasons to participate in the upcoming Great American Cleanup (GAC) of Broward County 2008—one for every resident who wants to keep Broward beautiful.

Each year, we ask Adopt-A-Street groups and school groups to participate in the Great American Cleanup. Almost 3,000 people participated last year. Yet, that is less than 0.2 percent of Broward County's population. Does that mean that only one person in 5,000 wants a cleaner environment and is willing to help make it a reality? This year, we are asking all residents to participate. With 1.7 million people living in an area that is 1,205 square miles, there are approximately 1,347 people per square mile.

Think about how many people you pass on the road every day. And how many of them litter? How many turn off lights when they leave a room, carpool to work, have planted a tree, or recycle every day. The point is, imagine the difference we can make if we use the power of that many people to improve our local environment.

Adopt-A-Street groups and many school groups will participate in the GAC between March 1 and May 31. Join us! Get a group together and adopt a street; sign up your school to take part; or, on Saturday, March 8, take part in the Marine Industries Association of South Florida's Waterway Cleanup (see insert for more information). Imagine the difference we can all make together!

Join us for the largest one-day environmental cleanup effort in Broward County, organized and sponsored by the Marine Industries Association of South Florida (MIASF), with support from local businesses, government agencies and civic organizations. Adopt-A-Street is sponsoring a cleanup site at the Wheelabrator facility located near the corner of Orange Drive and State Road 441.

There are 33 cleanup sites around Broward County. Event flyers and details will be available at Publix Supermarkets, local marine and non-marine retail stores, and online at www.waterwaycleanup.org.

Waterway Cleanup is a great way to learn about and help preserve our marine environment, and everyone is encouraged to participate! Volunteers are needed to work along the shorelines and waterfront as well as on the water in boats.

Adopt-A-Street sponsors the household hazardous waste removal/recycling and site recycling pickup for the event. Volunteers will separate recyclable material into clear bags away from the dumpsters. We also ensure that the Volunteer Trash Bash after the party is litter free. Recycling bins will be placed throughout the party location for volunteers to recycle plastic, glass and aluminum!

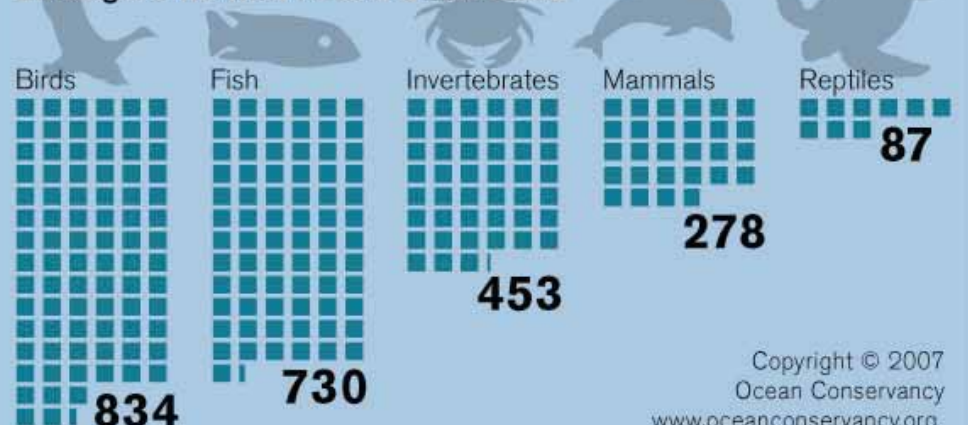

I wish you all the best this New Year!

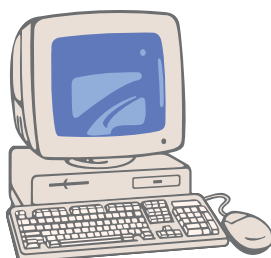
