

A Message From the CEO

The first month of 2022 is over, but unfortunately, that is not the case with the COVID-19 pandemic, which continues to evolve with new challenges in its third year. Today, healthcare heroes in many U.S. communities are battling omicron and delta strains of the coronavirus. Still, as more people globally receive vaccines and booster shots, we hope 2022 could be the year we can eventually say "Adios COVID!"

Until then, let us focus on our New Year resolutions or essential tasks for 2022 and celebrate the accomplishments along the way – big or small – despite this lingering public health menace. For FLL, that includes celebrating a substantial revival in airport activity in 2021, with

domestic passenger volumes nearing pre-pandemic levels.

Last year, FLL welcomed 28 million passengers, a 70 percent increase from approximately 16.5 million travelers in 2020. Domestic travel drove the passenger growth with 23.7 million visitors, up 77% from 2020. Meanwhile, at a slower clip, international traffic improved 38% percent to 4.3 million travelers.

In 2021, the airport added two airlines – Flair and Avelo – and more new flights are on tap this year. Those include Frontier’s planned return in February with several destinations, some not currently served from FLL. Additionally, Norse Atlantic Airways is angling to launch service this year between FLL and Oslo, Norway, with other European cities likely added in the future. As excitement builds about the potential return of transatlantic service to FLL, we look forward to adding Norse to our airline roster.

As 2022 advances, the Broward County Aviation Department (BCAD) will continue working on multi-phase terminal modernization programs and guest amenities while aiming to break ground this summer on FLL’s new Terminal 5 project ([featured in September’s issue](#)). In January, two more concessions (Umaizushi and Starbucks) opened in Terminal 2, and a few others will debut airport-wide this year.

Recently, there has been media coverage about the deployment of 5G telecommunications technology across the U.S. and its potential disruptions to aviation safety and security. However, we anticipate minimal impacts on aircraft flight procedures at FLL since the airport has infrequent low visibility operations. Additionally, the

FAA has cleared 90 percent of the U.S. airline fleet to operate in these conditions. For more information on this evolving issue, visit [FAA.gov/5G](https://www.faa.gov/5G).

December passenger traffic recap

For the month of December, 2.6 million passengers flew through FLL marking a 49 percent increase from the same month in 2020. The airport's domestic passenger traffic rose 49% to approximately 2.12 million from December 2020, while international visitation climbed nearly 50 percent to 482,404 travelers.

When compared to pre-pandemic activity, December's passenger traffic was only 26% percent less than that of December 2019.

FLL greeted 28 million passengers in 2021, a 70 percent increase from approximately 16.5 million travelers in 2020. Domestic travel drove the passenger growth with 23.7 million visitors, up 77% from 2020. Meanwhile, at a slower clip, international traffic improved 38% percent to 4.3 million travelers.

Manatee Encounter

Lost mammal relocated to seaport waters

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and its marine mammal rescue partners safely relocated a young manatee from a retention pond at FLL to Port Everglades in early January.

Airport wildlife and environmental personnel on the scene during the successful relocation effort say the manatee appeared to be in good physical condition as it swam and fed on the pond's vegetation.

While preparing FLL's unusual visitor for transport, rescuers determined the sea cow was a 9-foot long, 700-pound male.

Flight Options Expand

News from Norse, Frontier

BCAD CEO/Director of Aviation Mark Gale welcomed Norse Atlantic Airways CEO Bjørn Tore Larsen (left) to FLL for a working meeting on January 21. The low-cost Scandinavian carrier has plans to start nonstop service between Fort Lauderdale and Oslo, Norway, with potential flights to more destinations in the future.

Meanwhile, on the domestic front, Frontier Airlines is [gearing up for its return to FLL](#) in next month. The Denver, Colo.-based carrier expects to launch new flights to Fort Lauderdale from 12 destinations starting Feb. 17-19. Those destinations include Stewart and Islip, NY; Providence, RI; Greenbay, WI and Portland, ME.




