

## FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for Broward County's Fort Lauderdale International Airport window repair due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 5637). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

<b>Floodplain:</b>	The project is located in an AE Zone, or the area of 1% annual chance for flooding, according to Broward County FIRM panel number 12011C0559H dated 8/18/2014.
<b>Proposed Work and Purpose:</b>	Broward County will repair damaged window glazing for 196 windows in Terminal 1 of the Fort Lauderdale International Airport, restoring these windows to their pre-disaster condition.
<b>Project Alternatives:</b>	The alternative that has been considered is the no action alternative. The no-action alternative is not practicable due to the necessity of functional windows for air traffic safety. Flood hazard minimization has already been achieved as the windows are elevated above the base flood elevation. There are no practicable alternative locations outside the floodplain that would serve the needs of the airport.
<b>Comments:</b>	This will serve as the final public notice regarding the above-described action funded by the FEMA PA program.
