October Passenger Traffic Rebounds

Total passenger traffic for October 2017 was 2,395,526, up 18.2% over October last year. Domestic traffic was up 17.0%. International traffic was up 22.8%.

The hurricane hangover that we thought would impact October traffic did not happen. In fact, the estimated load factor for October 2017 was 2 percentage points higher than last October. Great news!

Commercial air carrier operations for October 2017 were 20,987 take offs and landings, up 18.7%. There were 107 more daily operations vs. October last year.


FLL has now had positive growth in total passenger traffic for 43 out of the last 44 months.

We Expect a Very Busy Cruise Season

The chart below shows the month-over-month increase in inbound scheduled available seats. Load factors have been constant. We expect passenger traffic to increase accordingly.

To put this into perspective, last season there were three days where inbound seats exceeded 63,000. This season there are 19 days were inbound seats exceed 65,000. The chart below shows the busy days and peak periods.

- Fastest growing large hub airport for the 12 months ending September.
- Ranked 12th in international traffic for 12 months ending September.

New Service

- Norwegian to Martinique on October 30th.
- JetBlue to Salt Lake City in November, Atlanta starting in March 2018.
- Delta to Salt Lake City in November.
- Allegiant to Milwaukee and Norfolk in November.
- Southwest to Punta Cana, San Jose, and Providenciales in November, Aruba in March 2018, San Antonio in July 2018.
- Azul to Belem, Brazil in December and Recife, Brazil in March 2018.
- Spirit to Columbus in February 2018, Richmond in March 2018, and seasonal Seattle starting in April 2018.

32+ Million Passengers in 2017

Based on scheduled available seats and historical load factor data, we expect total passenger traffic to exceed 32 million in 2017.

That number will move FLL ahead of LaGuardia and Philadelphia airports. FLL should be ranked as the 19th busiest airport for 2017 moving up two spots from the 21st position in 2016.
