## **Broward County Animal Care Advisory Committee Information Sheet**

- 1. Broward County is committed to the welfare of its pet population. This commitment is realized via four pillars: excellent shelter operations, equitable provision of services, public safety, and community commitment to animal care.
- 2. <u>Section 12.289</u> of the Broward County Administrative Code creates a Broward County Animal Care Advisory Committee to help develop the planning, goals and policies that support these four pillars.
- 3. Duties of Advisory Committee members are:
  - a. Advise on animal care related policies, programs, services, and long-range plans.
  - b. Advise the Broward County Board of County Commissioners on revisions to the Broward County Animal Care and Regulation ordinance (<u>Chapter 4</u> of the Broward County Code of Ordinances).
  - c. Coordinate closely with the Director of the Animal Care and Adoption Division, Ms. Emily Wood (<u>emwood@broward.org</u>, 954-357-9752).
  - d. May serve on the Animal Care General Trust Fund Subcommittee, which makes determinations on providing emergency medical or surgical treatment and care to sick or injured dogs and cats.
- 4. Figure 1 provides the desirable attributes of Advisory Committee members and Figure 2 the categories of membership currently vacant.

## Figure 1. Advisory Committee Member Attributes

- ✓ Broward County resident.
- ✓ Represent a membership category (see Figure 2).
- ✓ A demonstrated passion for pet welfare.
- ✓ Committed to the four pillars of ACAD: shelter management, equitable services, public safety, and community involvement.
- ✓ Represents a significant constituency.
- $\checkmark$  A track record of achievement for the community.
- ✓ Strong network within the animal care community or a willingness to build that network.
- ✓ Strong communication skills and will be assertive and persistent if necessary.
- ✓ Aligns with one or more of the following demographics (from the 2010 Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development *Consumer Policy Toolkit*): young adult, seniors, tech savvy, high technical literacy, minority, and disadvantaged.
- ✓ Understands group processes and works constructively within them.
- ✓ Practices data driven decision making.
- $\checkmark$  Willing to meet with the committee at least four times per year.
