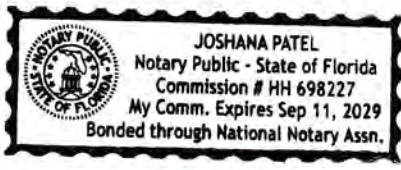

Presenting Complaint: Neuter

History Gus, Great Pyrenees, 5 Yrs. 0 Mos., Neutered Male who presented to BluePearl Ft. Lauderdale ER Service for evaluation of neuter incision opening. Patient was adopted about a week ago and at that time, he was also neutered. Patient was prescribed gabapentin and carprofen and did not go home with an e-collar. Owner noted that same week, the scrotum was getting swollen and today there was discharge coming from the incision site. Owner presented to his primary veterinarian a few times this past week where he received vaccines and also laser treatment for the swelling. Today, the incision is draining and owner wanted re-evaluation.

Current Medications: Gabapentin 300 mg PO q8-12h, Carprofen 100mg PO q12h

septic solution, the scrotum is swollen and the incision appears to be opening. A scrotal ablation may be considered at your primary veterinarian to prevent further swelling.

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Medications:

Amoxicillin/Potassium Clavulanate 500mg/125mg: Give 1 and 1/2 tablets by mouth every 12 hours. Give with food. You were provided a written prescription to be filled at a human pharmacy.

Gabapentin 300 mg: Give 1-2 tablets by mouth every 8-12 hours as needed for pain. Side effects may include sedation. You are able to increase the dose to 2 tablets (600mg) based on his weight.

Rimadyl 100mg: Give 1 tablet by mouth every 12 hours. Give with food. Do not change the dose that was previously prescribed.

Diet: Normal diet.

We recommend the brands Royal Canin, Hill's Science Diet, or Purina Proplan

Please do not feed a "grain-free", raw food, or limited ingredient diet as these have been linked to serious heart disease in dogs. Brands that are NOT recommended include: Acana, Zignature, Taste of the Wild, 4Health, Earthborn Holistic, Blue Buffalo, Nature's Domain, Fromm, Merrick, California Natural, Natural Balance, Orijen, Nature's Variety, NutriSource, Nutro, Rachael Ray Nutrish

At home monitoring:

Please monitor the incisions for redness, dark discoloration, swelling, heat, pain, bleeding, or purulent discharge (pus). Please contact a veterinarian if any abnormalities are noted.

Exercise: Restrict to leash walks only for the next 2 weeks. No running, jumping, rough play, or off leash activity can be allowed.

Wound Care: The incision and associated surgery site may become swollen and bruised over the next few days which is normal. You should become concerned and call IF:

- The wound becomes very swollen or discharges a yellow or green material
- Your pet suddenly becomes very depressed or lethargic.
- Your pet licks at the wounds. This can quickly lead to infection. Use the e-collar at all times.

Elizabethan collar : Please keep this on at all times. Animals are very quick at chewing sutures out if you leave them unattended with the collar off. You may remove it to clean it. Most patients learn how to eat and drink with it on.


If Gus will allow, please place a cold compress on the incision 3-4 times a day for 10-15 minutes at a time for 1-3 days. You should wrap an ice pack in a towel and apply to the incision sites. Please DO NOT apply cold directly to the incision.

Follow up/Recheck:

Please have Gus rechecked by your regular veterinarian this week to consider a scrotal ablation.

Gus presented to Emergency for evaluation of drainage from the neuter incision site. We flushed the incision with anti-septic solution. The scrotum is swollen and the incision appears to be opening. A scrotal ablation may be considered at your primary veterinarian to prevent further swelling.

Medications:

Amoxicillin/Potassium Clavulanate 500mg/125mg: Give 1 and 1/2 tablets by mouth every 12 hours. Give with food. You were provided a written prescription to be filled at a human pharmacy.

Gabapentin 300 mg: Give 1-2 tablets by mouth every 8-12 hours as needed for pain. Side effects may include sedation. You are able to increase the dose to 2 tablets (600mg) based on his weight.

Rimadyl 100mg: Give 1 tablet by mouth every 12 hours. Give with food. Do not change the dose that was previously prescribed.

Diet: Normal diet.

We recommend the brands Royal Canin, Hill's Science Diet, or Purina Proplan

Please do not feed a "grain-free", raw food, or limited ingredient diet as these have been linked to serious heart disease in dogs. Brands that are NOT recommended include; Acana, Zignature, Taste of the Wild, 4Health, Earthborn Holistic, Blue Buffalo, Nature's Domain, Fromm, Merrick, California Natural, Natural Balance, Orijen, Nature's Variety, NutriSource, Nutro, Rachael Ray Nutrish

At home monitoring:

Please monitor the incisions for redness, dark discoloration, swelling, heat, pain, bleeding, or purulent discharge (pus). Please contact a veterinarian if any abnormalities are noted.

Exercise: Restrict to leash walks only for the next 2 weeks. No running, jumping, rough play, or off leash activity can be allowed.

Wound Care: The incision and associated surgery site may become swollen and bruised over the next few days which is normal. You should become concerned and call IF:

- The wound becomes very swollen or discharges a yellow or green material
- Your pet suddenly becomes very depressed or lethargic.
- Your pet licks at the wounds. This can quickly lead to infection. Use the e-collar at all times.

Elizabethan collar : Please keep this on at all times. Animals are very quick at chewing sutures out if you leave them unattended with the collar off. You may remove it to clean it. Most patients learn how to eat and drink with it on.



This patient is adoptable with a medical release due to suffering from periodontal disease that requires surgery for dental extractions. Unfortunately, most adult dogs and cats have periodontal disease due to the lack of teeth brushing. Halitosis or bad breath is the primary sign of periodontal disease. Dogs' and cats' breath should not have a disagreeable odor. When periodontal disease advances, inability to chew hard food as well as excessive drooling with or without blood may occur. When periodontal disease is not treated, bacteria can continue to reproduce, creating deep pockets under the gum and teeth through bone destruction. If left untreated, periodontal diseases may cause loose painful teeth, tooth loss as well as internal disease. Treatment depends on the severity of disease. Early stages can be treated by teeth cleaning, polishing, application of antimicrobial products that help with plaque accumulation. In more advanced such as this patient, surgery is necessary to treat the affected teeth through specific procedures or extraction. Daily plaque control through tooth brushing is the key to help prevent periodontal disease. Special foods and treats are also available to help control calculus. Some products are approved by the Veterinary Oral Health Council. Any interested adopter must make an appointment with their own veterinarian for evaluation of patient to determine the best course of treatment within 48 hours of adoption. 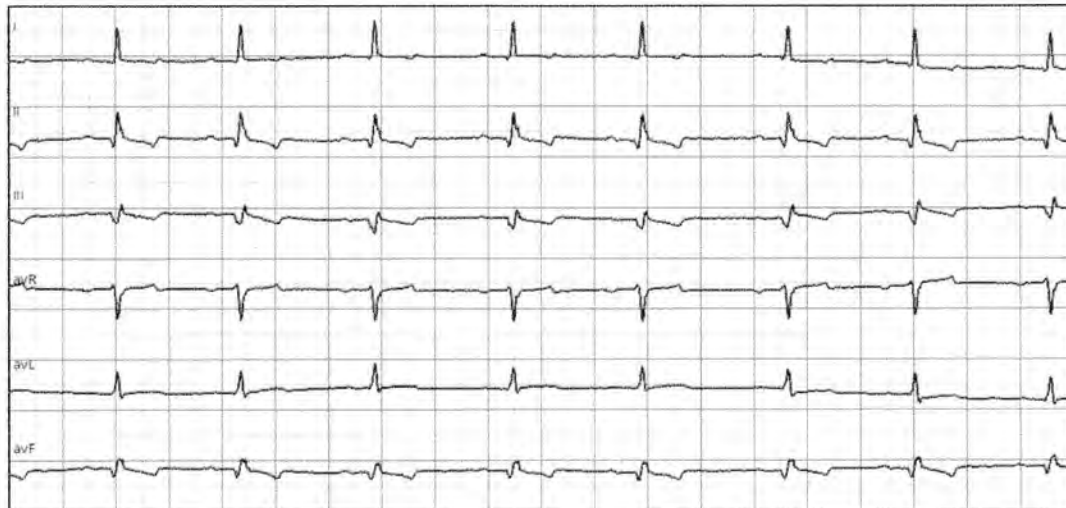
