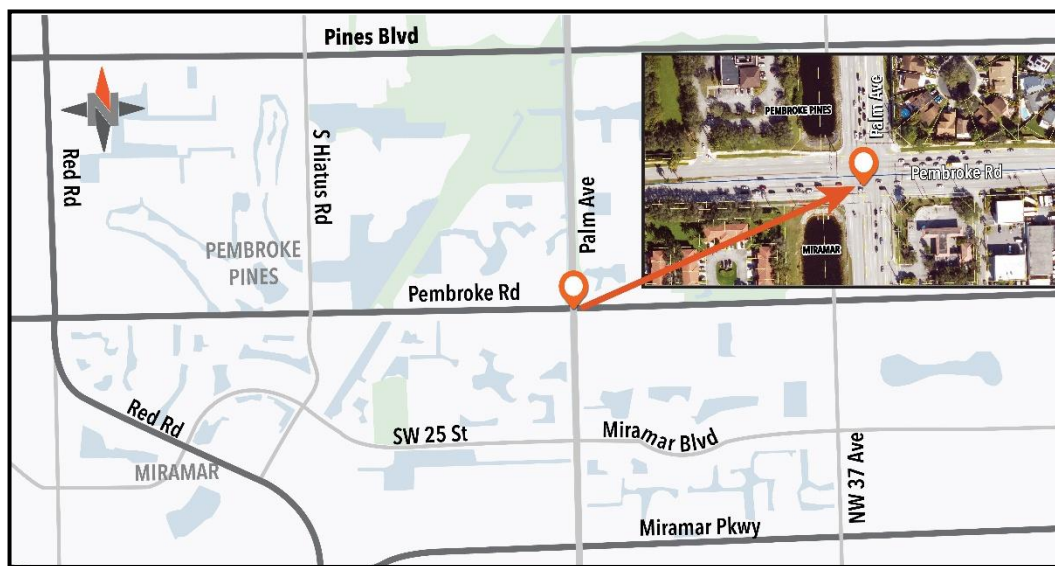

The Broward County Highway Construction and Engineering Division will hold a **PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING** for the proposed Improvements at the intersection of Pembroke Road and Palm Avenue within the Cities of Pembroke Pines and Miramar in Broward County, Florida. The purpose of this project is to enhance infrastructure and improve safety for all users of the intersection of Pembroke Road and Palm Avenue. The proposed improvements include adding an additional through lane in each direction, along with related operational and safety enhancements to improve capacity and mobility for all roadway users.
