

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-601

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEARS 2021 THROUGH 2025; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 20, Part III, Section 20.24 of the Broward County Administrative Code (“Administrative Code”) provides for the annual adoption and approval of a Five-Year Capital Program by the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida (“Board”);

WHEREAS, the Broward County Administrator (“County Administrator”) has presented the Five-Year Capital Program to the Board in public workshops, which included Fiscal Years One through Five of the Capital Program, and the Board adopted Fiscal Year One of the Capital Program as its annual 2020-2021 Capital Budget; and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator and the Board have complied with all requirements of the Florida Statutes and the Administrative Code, and desire to approve the projected expenditures and revenues for Fiscal Years Two through Five of the Capital Program, which, in conjunction with the adopted 2020-2021 annual Capital Budget, represent the Capital Program, as amended, NOW, THEREFORE,

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
2 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

4 Section 1. The Board hereby approves its final Capital Program, including the
5 Capital Budget adopted by the Board on September 22, 2020, for the Fiscal Year
6 beginning October 1, 2020, and ending September 30, 2021, and including projected
7 expenditures and revenues for capital projects for the Fiscal Years 2020-2021 through
8 2024-2025, as shown on the Capital Program Summary attached to this Resolution as
9 Exhibit A.

11 Section 2. This Resolution and a copy of the final Capital Program as adopted
12 and approved shall be filed with the Broward County Division of Records, Taxes and
13 Treasury.

15 Section 3. Severability.

16 If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the
17 invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the
18 remainder of this Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in
19 part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance,
20 such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other
21 individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.
