Program Goals: Offer selected VIP candidates the opportunity to gain insight into the new, dynamic and changing world of public sector employment and prepare them for exciting opportunities with Broward County. Volunteer Interns will also be mentored by senior staff, contribute to agency goals, and make a difference.

To Qualify:

- Volunteer Interns must be enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree-seeking program at an accredited college, university, or a Council on Occupational Education (COE) accredited vocational/technical school and remain an active student throughout the internship period.
- Volunteer Interns must possess an overall grade point average of 2.5 or above.

VIP Advantages:

- Gain valuable work experience within one of the County's 50+ agencies.
- Integrate theory with practice in a government environment.
- Receive academic credit based on school's internship requirements.

VIP is an unpaid temporary placement in a Broward County Agency. Minimum duration of assignment is equivalent to one semester or 3 - 4 months. (Spring/Winter, Summer or Fall). Volunteer Interns will work a maximum of 20 hours per week.
