 - economic opportunities associated with resiliency investments
 - recommended strategies to incentivize and improve community resilience
 - public outreach and engagement.

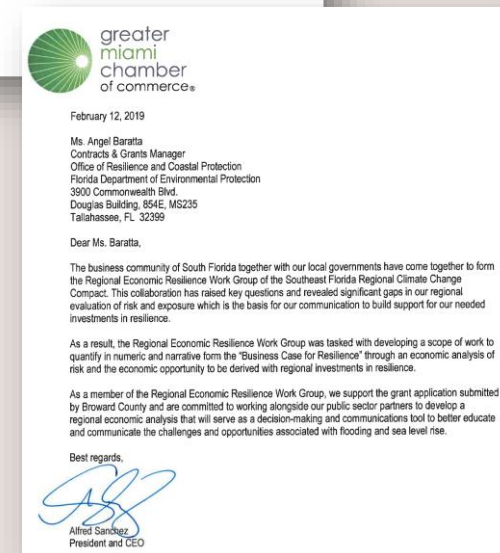
Economic Resilience

➤ Proposed approach:

- Management by ULI
- Use of REMI for regional economic modeling
- Outreach via Chambers and Compact Summit

➤ Project budget \$225-250K

- Counties - \$100K
- FDEP Grant - \$75K (decision pending)
- Business Community - \$50K
- In-kind - \$25K

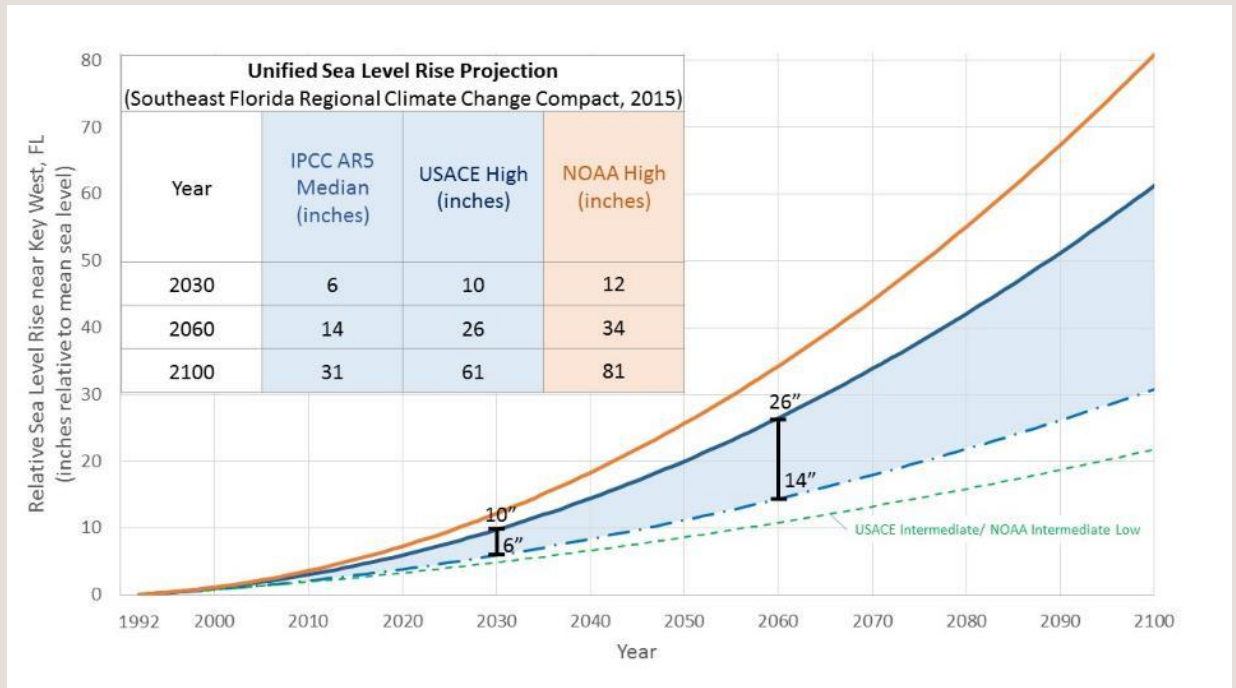
