



State Preemptions

- 403.7033 Departmental analysis of particular recyclable materials.
 - "...no local government, local governmental agency, or state government agency may enact any rule, regulation, or ordinance regarding use, disposition, sale, prohibition, restriction, or tax of such auxiliary containers, wrappings, or disposable plastic bags."
- 500.90 Regulation of polystyrene products preempted to department.
 - "...does not limit the authority of a local government to restrict the use of polystyrene by individuals on public property, temporary vendors on public property, or entities engaged in a contractual relationship with the local government for the provision of goods or services..."

F.S. 379.233 Release of balloons

• the release into the atmosphere of large numbers of balloons inflated with lighter-than-air gases poses a danger and nuisance to the environment, particularly to wildlife and marine animals.

 It is unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to intentionally release, organize the release, or intentionally cause to be released within a 24hour period 10 or more balloons inflated with a gas that is lighter than air

Proposed Polystyrene Admin. Code Who & Where Regulation Applies

- → County personnel (e.g., purchases, distribution).
- → County vendors, contractors, licensees, or permittees.
- → Individuals on any County property.

- → County properties/facilities, public parks, boat ramps or docks.
- → Balloons and confetti any outdoor area on County property.

Proposed Polystyrene Admin. Code What is Regulated

Prohibited from County Property and County Facilities

- → Polystyrene foam (incl. packing materials, food ware e.g., clamshell containers)
- → Single-use plastic beverage straws, single-use plastic stirrers
- → Unencapsulated polystyrene foam products (coolers, beach/pool toys)

Prohibited from Outdoor Areas of County Property

- → Confetti
- → Balloons
