

The Broward County Charter provides for a separation between the legislative and administrative functions of government. The County Commission is the legislative and policy-making elects a Mayor and Vice Mayor for one-year terms. The Mayor is presiding officer and the County's official representative. The Commission appoints the County Administrator, County Attorney, County Auditor and numerous advisory and regulatory boards.

The County Commission meets in formal sessions on Tuesdays, as scheduled, at 10AM in Room 422 of the Broward County Governmental Center. Meetings are broadcast on local cable systems and webcast live on Broward.org and social media. A replay of the Commission meeting broadcast and webcast is shown each Friday following a Tuesday meeting, at 5:30PM. A video of the meeting can be viewed on demand by noon Wednesday at Broward.org/Commission/Meetings. Animal Care Division provides shelter and second chances for dogs and cats in need. A team of Animal Care specialists help protect public safety by enforcing the County's animal ordinances, picking up stray animals and rescuing animals in distress.

Through Animal Care, residents can adopt a pet, volunteer or foster. Residents may also look for their lost pet.

- Adoptions: The Adoption Center is open for the adoption of dogs and cats Tuesday through Sunday from 11AM to 5:30PM. All adoptions include spaying/neutering, vaccinations, a microchip and Broward County pet license tag.
- Pet License Tag: Pet license tags can be purchased in person at the Adoption Center, online at Broward.org/Animal/ TagsandShots or obtained tag from local veterinary offices that sell the County tags. Pet license tags are required by law for all dogs and cats residing in the County.

The Greater Fort Lauderdale/Broward County Convention Center, located just south of 17th Street at the northern end of Port Everglades, is owned by Broward County. The Convention Center is the site for conventions, trade shows, consumer shows and various special events.

The first phase of the highly anticipated Convention Center expansion – the 350,000 square feet exhibit hall – opened October 2021. Work on the remainder of the \$1.2 billion expansion continues, including an eastside expansion with waterfront ballrooms, meeting rooms and kitchen facilities, an expansive outdoor waterfront plaza and an 800-room upscale headquarters hotel interconnected with the Convention Center. Full completion is expected in late 2025.

Records, Taxes and Treasury Division serves as an agent of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles for issuing state motor vehicle license plates and parking placards, and processes applications for titles on automobiles, trucks, mobile homes and vessels.

Under state law, if you own a motor vehicle, you must renew your tag (vehicle registration) each year by midnight of your birthday. When you renew your tag, you must present proof of Florida insurance, which includes personal injury protection (PIP) insurance and at least \$10,000 in property damage liability (PDL) insurance. You must also supply the driver's license number of the vehicle owner and coowner, if applicable.

If you own a mobile home, you must renew your registration each year by December 31.

Most company-owned vehicles must renew vehicle registration by June 30.

New residents may apply for their auto tag or mobile home registration and a Florida title at one of the County's auto tag agencies listed below. States have different requirements; come fully prepared with all documents showing proof of ownership. Vehicle identification number and odometer reading must be recorded on a special form that the division provides.

Vehicle titles when issued are maintained electronically unless a paper title is requested to be printed. Be prepared to submit proof of required Florida insurance, the driver's license number(s) of all vehicle owners and vehicle color.

Building Code Division's Building Permitting office has permitting jurisdiction for properties in Unincorporated areas of Broward County and requires property owners or their licensed contractors to obtain a permit for new construction or for certain alterations of an existing residential or commercial building. This ensures that the work will be performed in conformance with the Florida Building Code and all applicable ordinances, building codes, laws, rules, resolutions and regulations in effect in Broward County. This Division performs inspections to verify that the work is done in accordance with these laws, thus protecting the health, safety and welfare of the public, and helping the business or home owner to avoid enforcement penalties for non-compliant work, which may be hazardous or dangerous. Any individual or business wishing to conduct or advertise a "Fire Sale," "Going Out of Business Sale," or any liquidation sale (any sale that would have the public believe that, upon disposal of all stock of goods on hand, the business would be discontinued) is required by the State of Florida (F.S. 559.20) to apply for and purchase a "Going Out of Business Permit." Applications are available at the address listed above or online at Broward.org/ RecordsTaxesTreasury. Included with the application should be a copy of the proposed advertising, the current County local business tax receipt, the city local business tax receipt and a copy of the current inventory listing goods to be sold. The application fee is \$50, payable by cash, cashier's check or money order. Prior to the issuance of the permit, all tangible personal property and real estate taxes (if applicable) must be paid. The permit is valid for not more than 60 consecutive days from issue date, including Sundays and any legal holidays, and is not renewable.

Records, Taxes and Treasury Division works in conjunction with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, is responsible for the sale of saltwater fishing and freshwater fishing licenses, and hunting licenses. Licenses are valid for one year from date of issue.

Any member of the United States Armed Forces stationed in Florida is considered a resident for the purpose of licensing fees. Spouses and dependent children residing in the household would also receive resident rate licenses.

- If you are a Florida resident 65 years of age or older, you do not need a hunting or fishing license; however, you must be able to furnish proof of age and residency if requested to do so by law enforcement officials.
- Residents who are 100 percent disabled may present authorized disability statements, signed by a Florida physician, to the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division. Upon approval by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, an exemption card will be issued and mailed to the applicant. It is renewable in five years.

A freshwater fishing license is required for fishing in the state's freshwater areas. There is also an option to purchase a Five-Year License, Resident Lifetime License, or a combined Lifetime Freshwater Fishing and Hunting License. You do not need a freshwater fishing license if:

- You are a child under the age of 16 years.
- You are a Florida resident and a member of the United States Armed Forces not stationed in this state while on leave for 30 days or less (upon submission of orders).
- You are a resident fishing for non-commercial purposes in the County of your residence with live or natural bait, using poles or hand lines that are not equipped with a reel or other line retrieval mechanisms (e.g. cane pole). #### A saltwater fishing license is required for:

• Fishing from leisure craft (each person must have a license with them).

- Fishing from a sandbar or other land mass that is accessible by boat or by swimming through water deeper than three feet.
- Anyone diving who takes, attempts to take, or possesses any marine fish.
- All nonresidents fishing in saltwater (excluding fishing from a licensed pier).
- Anyone who operates any vessel wherein a fee is paid either directly or indirectly for the purpose of taking, attempting to take, or possessing any marine fish for noncommercial purposes.

You do not need a saltwater fishing license if you are under 16 years of age, or if you are fishing from a for-hire vessel guide, charter or party boat that has a valid vessel license.

A separate license is required for each vessel or individual. An additional fishing stamp is required to catch snook or crawfish.

Hunting licenses are annual permits effective one year from date of issuance. A combination license, the Florida Resident's Sportsman's License, is also offered. It includes resident hunting, resident freshwater fishing, archery, muzzle loading, and state waterfowl, turkey and management stamp. This license satisfies all state requirements for recreational hunting and freshwater fishing for Florida residents.

Licenses may be purchased at the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division office, and at sporting goods stores and bait and tackle shops.

#### **Real Estate Property Taxes**

Ad valorem taxes (based on property value) and non ad valorem taxes (special assessments) are collected on an annual basis beginning on November 1 for the tax year January through December of the current year. The Office of the Property Appraiser establishes the value of the property, and the Board of County Commissioners, together with the taxing bodies, set the millage rate.

Using these values and allowing for any exemptions, the tax roll is prepared by the Property Appraiser and then certified by the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division, which prints and mails the tax notice to the owner's address as it appears on the certified tax roll. Address changes must be directed to the Property Appraiser's Office.

It is the responsibility of each taxpayer to see that he or she receives a tax bill and that his or her taxes are paid. Tax bills are mailed out by November 1 of each year and are due by March 31 with the following discounts for early payment:

4 percent – if paid in November 3 percent – if paid in December 2 percent – if paid in January 1 percent – if paid in February

Taxes become delinquent April 1 of each year, at which time a 3 percent interest penalty must be added to the bill.

Property owners without mortgages, or who do not make use of an escrow arrangement, may pay their taxes in one of several ways:

Credit Card/Debit Card: Pay online at broward.county-taxes.com using a Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover credit card, or a debit/ check card with a Visa or MasterCard logo. There is an additional fee for paying with a credit or debit card. The fee schedule is listed online.

**Electronic Check:** Pay online through any U.S. bank at broward.county-taxes.com. Your payment will be automatically deducted from your bank account. There is no fee for this service. If you use an online bank check from your bank, there will be a delay in processing your payment.

Mail: Use the envelope enclosed with the tax bill, or mail your payment to Broward County Board of County Commissioners, P.O. Box 105048, Atlanta, GA 30348-5048.

Be sure to include the payment coupon to avoid delays in processing. Checks must be drawn on a U.S. bank, in U.S. dollars. Should your check not clear for any reason, your payment will be canceled and you will be charged a return check fee. Post dated checks will not be held.

In Person: Pay in person at any Wells Fargo Bank branch in Broward County. Please visit Broward.org/RecordsTaxesTreasury to locate the branch nearest you or call **311** or **954-831-4000**. You must have a payment coupon with you to pay. Payments are only accepted at this location from November 1 through March 31.

Pay in person at the Governmental Center, 115 S. Andrews Avenue, Room A100, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33301. The hours of operation are Monday - Friday from 8:30AM to 5PM. Installments: You may pay next year's taxes in quarterly installments. To pay in installments, you must first file an application with the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division before May 1. The first installment payment would be due by June 30. To download an application, visit broward.county-taxes.com or call 311 or 954-831-4000 and one will be mailed. There is no fee for making quarterly installment payments and discounts are offered.

Partial Payments: Pay your current taxes in up to five payments. Each of the first four payments must be at least \$100 and must include a \$10 processing fee. The fifth payment must be paid in full, must also include a \$10 processing fee and must be made by March 31 to avoid delinquency. There will be no discount. No partial payments can be made after March 31. There will not be any monthly billing for any balances owed.

#### **Delinquent Property Taxes**

A late tax notice will be mailed by April 30 to each taxpayer whose current tax payment has not been received. The notice will include a description of the property and advise the owner that if property taxes are not paid, a tax certificate will be sold for these taxes, and the property itself may be sold at a future date. On or about May 1, the listing of unpaid taxes is published in the newspaper, once a week for three weeks. The listing notifies residents that there will be a sale of tax certificates on all real property with delinquent taxes pursuant to state statute. The amount due on each parcel will include interest at the rate of 18 percent per year from the date of delinguency to the date of sale, the cost of advertising and the expense of the sale.

The redemption of delinquent taxes must be made by certified funds, such as a cashier's check or wire transfer. Payment must be received by the last working day of the month. The amounts due are subject to change. Prior to payment, call the delinquent real estate tax office at the number above. You can visit online at Broward.org/RecordsTaxesTreasury to review many of the "Frequently Asked Questions" pertaining to Delinquent Real Estate Taxes and to pay online using a credit card.

#### **Tourist Development Tax**

Residential accommodations rented for a period of six months or less are subject to the Tourist Development Tax. Broward County's Tourist Development Tax is 6 percent of the total rental charges. It should be collected from the tenant and remitted to the Broward County Tax Collector Tourist Development Tax Section. Tourist Development Tax is not due on residential real estate property rentals if a bona fide written lease for longer than six months has been signed prior to the commencement of the rental.

#### **Tangible Property Tax**

Tangible personal property tax is an ad valorem assessment against the furniture, fixtures and equipment located in businesses and rental property. It also applies to mobile homes not taxed as real property (if the mobile home does not have a current registration decal properly affixed), and to structural additions to mobile homes

Assessments are as of January 1 of the current calendar year, and due November 1 or after the roll is certified to the tax collector by the property appraiser. Taxes become delinquent April 1 of the next year, at which time 1.5 percent interest per month is added. Within 45 days after delinquency, the property is advertised in a local newspaper, and advertising costs are added to the amount of the unpaid tax.

Tax warrants are issued June 1 on all unpaid tangible personal property taxes. Within 30 days, the tax collector applies to the circuit court for an order directing levy and seizure of the property for the amount of unpaid taxes and costs. Although the tax collector is responsible for collecting tangible personal property tax, changes to that tax roll (e.g. name, address, location and assessed value) are processed through the property appraiser

#### **Local Business Tax Receipts**

A local business tax receipt is issued by this division for engaging in or managing any business, profession or occupation in Broward County. Anyone providing merchandise or services to the public, even through a one-person company or homebased business, must obtain a County local business tax receipt. If a business performs

several functions, it may be necessary to acquire more than one local business tax receipt. New businesses must obtain their local business tax receipt prior to engaging in their enterprise. All businesses must maintain a current receipt.

Businesses located within the limits of a municipality are required to have a city local business tax receipt AND a Broward County local business tax receipt. If the business is within the Broward Municipal Services District, a Certificate of Use from County Zoning must be obtained before a local business tax receipt will be issued.

It is the responsibility of the person or business to ensure that all local, state and federal laws and regulations have been complied with, in regards to the particular business. Certain business categories will be required to submit proof of active permits and certifications from State or County agencies before a local business tax receipt will be issued.

- An application must be submitted in person to obtain the County business tax receipt. Applications may be obtained from the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division or downloaded from Broward.org/ RecordsTaxesTreasury.
- If the business name used in the business does not include the full first name and last name of the business owner, the business name would be considered a fictitious name, and must be registered with the Florida Secretary of State's Office. For more information, visit sunbiz.org. County Commission Services Section 242
- Business tax receipts are renewed annually, beginning July 1 through September 30. The receipt is valid from October 1 through September 30 of the following year. New receipts are issued at any time during the year, and are prorated from April 1, at which time half-year fees apply.
- Fees vary based on the nature of the business or occupation and variables such as number of employees, equipment, seating capacity and the date the business opened.
- Failure to renew a local business tax receipt will subject the owner to delinquent fees.

It is the business owner's responsibility to report to the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division any change of address, name change, ownership transfer or business closure. If you need to make changes to an existing license you must contact or come into the Records, Taxes and Treasury Division. A 10 percent transfer fee applies to all changes except a change of mailing address.

Broward County Transit Division provides Paratransit service, also known as TOPS (Transportation Options), to qualified persons who, because of physical, cognitive or visual disabilities, are functionally unable to use the regular fixed-route bus service permanently or temporarily. Paratransit service operates the same hours as the fixed-route bus system. The service area includes the urbanized area of Broward County, a portion of northern Miami-Dade County and a portion of southern Palm Beach County. Service is available from Broward County to limited destinations and transfer locations in Palm Beach and Miami-Dade Counties by fixed bus route and paratransit. Paratransit riders who want to learn how to use the fixed-route bus system may request travel training. This personal, oneon-one instruction teaches individuals how to ride the fixed-route buses, and is free to qualified individuals. After completing travel training, a bonus pass is awarded for free bus service for a limited time.

#### **Living Wage**

Broward County's Living Wage Ordinance requires companies with large service contracts with Broward County to pay a minimum hourly wage plus benefits to their employees. Complaints about a covered company that is not paying employees as mandated should be filed with the Professional Standards and Human Rights Section.

#### **Wage Recovery**

Wage Recovery Ordinance provides a way for employees of any organization in the County (except for those exempted by the ordinance, including the federal government, the state of Florida and Indian Tribes) to file a complaint for non-payment of earned wages or underpayment of the wage rate applicable for the work performed. Claims not resolved through a conciliation process may be presented to a hearing officer who conducts a hearing taking testimony from necessary parties and determines whether the employer has violated the ordinance after which a final order is issued which may find for the employee regarding wages owed, and determine liquidated damages and reasonable attorney's fees and costs, if applicable.

Residents may register to vote at either of the offices listed below, 8:30AM to 5PM, Monday through Friday, excluding major holidays. To register to vote, an individual must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years of age and a legal resident of Florida and Broward County. If you are 16 years old, you may pre-register and receive your card in the mail after your 18th birthday. Anyone declared mentally incompetent who has not had his/her competency restored and anyone convicted of a felony who has not had his/her civil rights restored, is not eligible to vote. With 5,500 employees, including more than 2,600 sworn deputy sheriffs, the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) is a full-service public safety agency providing full-time law enforcement, detention, community control and fire rescue services to Broward County residents and visitors. BSO protects 13 Broward cities and Broward Municipal Services District areas with law enforcement services, in addition to the Broward County Courthouse, the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, Port Everglades and areas of the Everglades and the County's waterways.

BSO's Child Protective Investigations Section investigates allegations of abuse and neglect of Broward County's children for Florida's Department of Children and Families. BSO's Department of Detention and Community Control administers the County's four jails and its offender programs such as Pre-Trial Release, Drug Court, In-Custody Treatment, County Probation and Day Reporting. The division provides E911 and non-emergency intake, dispatch and Teletype services for 29 law enforcement and fire rescue agencies. The division functions 24/7, 365 days a year and is comprised of 40 supervisors and more than 400 specially-trained public safety telecommunicators. The division's E911 operators provide Emergency Medial Dispatch services as a first responder for all medical calls for service. All call takers are specially trained to relay important medical instructions in life-threatening situations. The Regional Communications Division operates three Public Safety Answering Points, located in Coconut Creek, Sunrise and Pembroke Pines, processing over 3.5 million calls yearly.

BSO's Department of Fire Rescue originated in October 2003 when all operational and administrative responsibilities were transferred from the Broward County Board of County Commissioners to the Broward Sheriff's Office.

With more than 600 professional and highly trained operations, support and administrative personnel, the department provides fire suppression, fire protection, emergency medical services and educational programs for most Broward Municipal Services District areas of Broward County and to the municipalities of Weston, Southwest Ranches, Pembroke Park, West Park through contract agreements. Additionally, the department serves Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport and Port Everglades.

Twelve stations for fire suppression and Advanced Life Support medical rescue operate in various locations in the County, 10 as engine companies and three as aerial companies. There is also an Air Rescue station located at the Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport. Fire Rescue administers the Hazardous Materials, Air Rescue, Aircraft Rescue Firefighting and the Technical Rescue teams, each addressing unique and frequently complex and dangerous situations. These teams operate Countywide.

The Broward County Property Appraiser, an elected Constitutional Officer, is responsible for annually appraising every parcel of real property and all commercial tangible personal property in Broward County at fair market value. The Property Appraiser is also in charge of granting Homestead Exemptions to eligible taxpayers who own and permanently reside in a Broward County home as of January 1. Other available exemptions include: widow/widower, senior citizens on qualified fixed incomes, disability, veteran's disability, legally blind, total and permanent disability, qualified historic properties, "granny flats," as well as exemptions for schools, churches, government property and charitable organizations. Exemption applications may be completed in the Property Appraiser's office, online at bcpa.net, or at a scheduled community outreach event (please see the Outreach Calendar on the website).

Applicants for Homestead must provide proof of legal residency (Florida driver's license/identification card and Broward voter registration card or recorded Declaration of Domicile). Non-U.S. citizens residing in Broward County must also provide proof of permanent residency or asylum/refugee status in order to qualify for Homestead. Homestead renewals are automatic so long as the ownership and use of the property have not changed. Individuals who commit fraud by improperly obtaining a Homestead Exemption may be subject to paying up to 10 years of back taxes plus penalties and interest.

The Property Appraiser advises the taxing authorities, such as the Broward County Commission, School Board, cities, hospital districts and others, of the taxable value of property in their area. The taxing authorities use this information about property values to set their annual millage (property tax) rates. The Property Appraiser does not set or collect taxes. The Public Defender's Office is responsible for representing persons charged in criminal cases who cannot afford to hire a private attorney for legal counsel. According to Florida law, the services of the Public Defender's Office are limited to persons who are found indigent by the Clerk of the Courts. A person seeking the assignment of the public defender must fill out an application with the Clerk of the Courts. The cost of the application is \$50. The affidavit questions the person's ability to afford private legal counsel. If the Clerk determines the person's finances meet the criteria for appointment, a public defender is assigned to the case. The Public Defender's Office handles capital and non-capital felony cases, as well as misdemeanor cases, juvenile cases and involuntary commitment cases.

The office also oversees and supervises the operation of these court programs:

#### **Court Interpreters Program**

The Court Interpreter's Office provides in-house Spanish and French/Creole interpreting services to defendants and witnesses in court proceedings at all four courthouse locations. Interpreting services are available for the following case types: circuit and county criminal, juvenile delinquency and dependency, paternity, domestic violence injunctions, mental health and incapacity proceedings, and any other matters in which the court determines an interpreter is necessary. Other languages, including sign language, are available upon request through contract interpreters.

### Court Mediation & Arbitration Programs (CMAP)

### Small Claim and County Court Mediation

This CMAP program provides mediation services as an effective alternative to a court trial. Civil cases such as landlord/tenant, eviction, breach of contract, employment, consumer disputes, and similar issues can be court-ordered to mediation. Mediators who are scheduled to work with these cases hold a Florida Supreme Court Certification as a County Court Mediator.

#### **Family Mediation**

954-831-6325

This CMAP program provides mediation as an opportunity to minimize the effects of divorce on families. Full-service mediation (including financial issues) is offered by court order prior to a divorce being finalized or for issues that arise after the divorce has been granted. To use this program, a case must be filed. Mediation scheduled through this program is subject to participant income limitations as specified by the legislature for state subsidized mediation. Fees are based on income. Mediators are certified as Family Court Mediators by the Florida Supreme Court.

#### **Dependency Mediation**

954-831-6325

This CMAP program handles cases filed in Juvenile Dependency Court with an Order to Mediation signed by a judge, including those with charges of alleged abuse, abandonment, neglect, or termination of parental rights. Multiple agencies are generally involved in these mediation sessions in an effort to place children in the healthiest and safest environment. Mediators are certified as Dependency Mediators by the Florida Supreme Court.

#### **Circuit Civil Mediation**

This CMAP program coordinates cases referred to private mediation by Circuit and Family Court Judges. Attorneys or Pro Se litigants may participate in this program if they seek a randomly selected mediator from the rotation list maintained by the program. Statistics for private mediation sessions reported by the mediator are compiled monthly.

#### **Non-Binding Arbitration**

This CMAP program evaluates applications for court arbitrators and maintains an updated listing of court-approved arbitrators. Program administrators maintain statistics for arbitration orders.

### **Broward Community Justice Alternatives**

Referrals may be from the State Attorney's Office when a charge has been filed, or in lieu of a charge being filed. Criminal cases such as harassment, battery, assault, as well as misdemeanors and violations of city ordinances, worthless checks, sales tax diversion and offenses deemed appropriate by the State Attorney's Office can be referred to this program. The program accepts self-referrals when no charges have been filed in such cases as neighborhood disputes, senior citizen issues, and other community problems and citizen disputes. All parties of a self-referral must agree to attempt to resolve their issues through mediation. In each case a certified county mediator will be assigned to assist the parties in resolving the issues. There is a charge of \$50 for a session for walk-ins

#### **Teen Court**

Teen Court is a diversionary program that offers an alternative to formal court proceedings for juveniles. Cases are referred by the State Attorney's Office and local law enforcement agencies. Teen Court addresses such charges as petit theft, misdemeanor drug possession, and trespassing. At Teen Court sentencing

hearings, trained school volunteers perform all courtroom roles, including those of bailiff, clerk and jurors. The presiding judge is either a member of the judiciary, a volunteer attorney, or one of the trained Teen Court professional staff. The jurors render a sentencing decision that can include counseling, essays, restitution, and jury duty assignments. Community service is a required sanction for most juveniles participating in the Teen Court Program. The defendant's compliance with these sanctions is tracked by a Teen Court case manager. If defendants do not comply with the rules and regulations of Teen Court, the case is returned to the State Attorney's Office for a filing decision. The Court intakes and hearings are held at the satellite courthouses or other applicable agency.

#### **Case Management Services Unit**

Case Managers are assigned to the family, mental health, domestic violence, dependency and delinquency courts to monitor the time and events involved in the movement of a case from the point of initiation to disposition by following mechanisms such as early screening, creation of event deadline and continuous oversight and measurement of progress. Information is provided to judges regarding case delay. Case managers also provide information to judges regarding community resources and monitor compliance with court-ordered services.

#### **General Magistrates**

Eleven General Magistrates provide auxiliary judicial functions in the areas of divorce, support enforcement, dependency and mental health, which relieves the workload of the Civil Division. The General Magistrates handle cases involving temporary relief, contempt of court, support enforcement, involuntary commitment, judgment of in-competency, guardianship, and modification of prior rulings.

Victim Advocate/Domestic Violence Specialists supervised by the State Attorney's Office provide case management services to individuals and families impacted by domestic violence. Referral services may include shelter, economic assistance, translation and counseling. Regular contact is maintained with the victims to assure safety and to address their needs before they are faced with crisis situations. Court orientation and accompaniment to court proceedings are provided in addition to crisis and supportive counseling.
