Attached please find the final report of the Broward Office of the Inspector General (OIG) regarding the above-captioned matter.

The OIG determined that City of Pompano Beach Mayor Rex Hardin engaged in campaign finance misconduct during his November 2018 campaign for commissioner, from which he ultimately withdrew, and his campaign for mayor in the same election cycle.

After withdrawing from the commissioner's race in May 2018, Mayor Hardin improperly disposed of the contributions donated to that campaign by transferring them to his mayoral campaign account, an option that was not legally available to him. Furthermore, he did not report any commissioner campaign activity or termination after April 2018 until he filed the termination report for his commissioner campaign in November 2018, three months after his final reporting deadline.

The OIG further determined that, for the mayoral campaign, Mayor Hardin used the services of his own company, Cypress Printing Center, Inc., of which he was the sole employee. Cypress Printing invoiced the campaign an aggregate of \$17,751.45, of which the campaign paid only \$12,149.85. Mayor Hardin improperly claimed the \$5,601.60 difference as in-kind contributions from himself despite the fact that he, personally, did not provide the campaign with anything of value, other than his services, to influence the results of the election. By law, any volunteered services from the candidate could not constitute an in-kind contribution. If they were in-kind contributions, they came from Cypress Printing and exceeded the \$1,000 maximum contribution allowed by law.

The OIG also determined that Mayor Hardin originally reported eleven of his "in-kind contributions" as loans when he did not, in fact, make such loans.

In addition, we found that, in February 2019, Mayor Hardin falsely reported in the mayoral campaign's termination report that he had transferred \$5,737.70 in surplus campaign funds to his office account; however, he did not make that transfer for another six months, which was six months past the disposal and reporting deadline. We identified other campaign finance violations, including numerous errors that Mayor Hardin addressed in amended reports he filed on the eye of his interview with our office.

In light of our findings, and in accordance with our charter mandate, we are referring this matter to the Florida Election Commission (FEC) and to the Broward State Attorney's Office for whatever action those agencies deem appropriate.

#### **SUMMARY**

The Broward Office of the Inspector General (OIG) has concluded its investigation into several allegations against City of Pompano Beach Mayor Rex Hardin, including that he failed to report certain expenditures of his mayoral campaign for the November 2018 election. The investigation substantiated that he engaged in campaign finance misconduct in that campaign as well as in his campaign to be re-elected commissioner during the same election cycle.

In October 2017, Mayor Hardin commenced his mayoral campaign for the November 2018 election. Between April 2018 and May 2018, he concurrently campaigned to keep his commission seat, which was not improper under Florida law. We determined that, after withdrawing from the commissioner's race in May 2018, Mayor Hardin did improperly dispose of the contributions donated to that campaign by transferring them in July 2018 to his mayoral campaign account, an option that was not legally available to him. Furthermore, he did not report any commissioner campaign activity or termination after April 2018 until he filed the termination report for his commissioner campaign in November 2018, three months after his final reporting deadline.

During the mayoral campaign, Mayor Hardin used the services of his own company, Cypress Printing Center, Inc., of which he was the sole employee. Cypress Printing invoiced the campaign an aggregate of \$17,751.45, of which the campaign paid only \$12,149.85. The difference was \$5,601.60, which the candidate improperly claimed as thirteen in-kind contributions from himself. He reported these in-kind contributions. If they were in-kind contributions, they came from Cypress Printing and exceeded the \$1,000 maximum contribution allowed by law. Moreover, any volunteered services from the candidate could not constitute an in-kind contribution. Thus, these reported contributions either amounted to an excessive contribution or the candidate willfully certified the CTRs that reported them as true and correct when they were not.

The OIG also determined that Mayor Hardin originally reported as loans eleven of his "in-kind contributions," when he did not, in fact, make such loans.

In addition, we found that, in February 2019, Mayor Hardin falsely reported in the mayoral campaign's termination report that he transferred \$5,737.70 in surplus mayoral campaign funds to

his office account.<sup>2</sup> We determined that, instead, a check to his office account for the actual balance (\$5,803.12) did not clear until six months later, which was six months past the disposal and reporting deadline.

We identified other violations of campaign finance law in the form of various errors in both campaigns' finance reports, including the failure to properly report contributions and expenditures. On the eve of his interview with our office, Mayor Hardin filed amended reports for the majority of these errors in addition to an amended termination report for the mayoral race.

This was the second time in three years that the OIG concluded that Mayor Hardin violated campaign finance law.<sup>3</sup> The first time involved his 2014 commissioner re-election campaign, which resulted in a Florida Elections Commission fine. In accordance with our charter mandate, once again, we are referring this matter to the FEC and the Broward State Attorney's Office for whatever action those agencies deem appropriate.

#### **OIG CHARTER AUTHORITY**

Section 10.01 of the Charter of Broward County empowers the Broward Office of the Inspector General to investigate misconduct and gross mismanagement within the Charter Government of Broward County and all of its municipalities. This authority extends to all elected and appointed officials, employees, and providers of goods and services to the county and the municipalities. On his own initiative, or based on a signed complaint, the Inspector General may commence an investigation upon a finding of good cause. As part of any investigation, the Inspector General shall have the power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, require the production of documents and records, and audit any program, contract, and the operations of any division of the county, its municipalities and any providers. The Broward Office of the Inspector General is also empowered to issue reports, including recommendations, and to require officials to provide reports regarding the implementation of those recommendations.

#### RELEVANT GOVERNING AUTHORITIES AND BACKGROUND

#### Campaign Treasurer's Reports

The Florida Division of Elections has promulgated four types of Campaign Treasurer's Report (CTR) Summaries: Monthly Reports, Primary Reports, General Election Reports, and Termination Reports. Each type of CTR is filed in a different phase of an election campaign (pre-qualifying, between the qualifying deadline and the primary date, after the primary date up to the general election date, and after the candidate is no longer a candidate). Each report within those types has

a different filing deadline and covers a specific time period as set forth in the instructions for CTRs and published by the city clerk, the statutory filing official.

#### Florida Campaign Financing Statutes

Florida Statutes, Chapter 106, governs municipal campaign financing including, among other matters, the appointment and duties of the campaign treasurer, CTR reporting requirements, use of campaign funds, and contribution limits.

Relevant sections of Chapters 106 in effect in 2018 are as follows:

#### Section 106.011, Florida Statutes – Definitions: ...

- (5) "Contribution" means:
- (a) A gift, subscription, conveyance, deposit, loan, payment, or distribution of money or anything of value, including contributions in kind having an attributable monetary value in any form, made for the purpose of influencing the results of an election or making an electioneering communication. . . .
- (c) The payment, by a person other than a candidate or political committee, of compensation for the personal services of another person which are rendered to a candidate or political committee without charge to the candidate or committee for such services. . . .

Notwithstanding the foregoing meanings of "contribution," the term may not be construed to include services, including, but not limited to, legal and accounting services, provided without compensation by individuals volunteering a portion or all of their time on behalf of a candidate or political committee or editorial endorsements. . . .

(14) "Person" means an individual or a corporation, association, firm, partnership, joint venture, joint stock company, club, organization, estate, trust, business trust, syndicate, or other combination of individuals having collective capacity. The term includes a political party, affiliated party committee, or political committee. . . .

# Section 106.021, Florida Statutes - Campaign treasurers; deputies; primary and secondary depositories:

Among other instructions, the section explains that a candidate may change the designation of office for which he or she intends to qualify for by filing a new Form DS-DE 9 and a written statement indicating the change with the filing officer. However, upon doing so, the candidate must notify each contributor in writing and offer to return his or her contribution through a specified procedure. If, after the candidate has complied with the procedure, the contributor is non-responsive, the candidate may use the contribution for the newly designated office up to the maximum of the contribution limits allowed by law.

#### Section 106.07, Florida Statutes - Reports; certification and filing:

The treasurer must file regular reports of all contributions received and all expenditures made. The contributor's name, address, occupation if over \$100, and amount must be listed. The report must also include a statement of each receipt not otherwise listed; each payee's name and address, amount, date, and purpose of each expenditure; and each reimbursement payee's name and address, amount, date, and purpose. The treasurer must keep a receipt. The candidate and treasurer must certify to each report's correctness. Each person so certifying bears responsibility for the accuracy and veracity of the report.

In any reporting period during which a candidate has not received funds, made any contributions, or expended any reportable funds, the filing of the required report for that period is waived. In instances where the candidate's duty to file the report is waived, the next report filed must specify that the report covers the entire period between the last submitted report and the report being filed. The candidate must notify the filing officer in writing on the prescribed reporting date that no report is being filed on that date.

It is a first-degree misdemeanor to willfully certify to correctness of a CTR knowing it is incorrect.

#### Section 106.08, Florida Statutes – Contributions; limitations on:

- (1)(a) Except for political parties or affiliated party committees, no person or political committee may, in any election, make contributions in excess of the following amounts: . . .
  2. To a candidate for retention as a judge of a district court of appeal; a candidate for legislative office; a candidate for multicounty office; a candidate for countywide office or in any election conducted on less than a countywide basis; or a candidate for county court judge or circuit judge, \$1,000.
- (b) The contribution limits provided in this subsection do not apply . . . to amounts contributed by a candidate to his or her own campaign. . . .
- (3)(a) Any contribution received by a candidate with opposition in an election or by the campaign treasurer or a deputy campaign treasurer of such a candidate on the day of that election or less than 5 days before the day of that election must be returned by him or her to the person or committee contributing it and may not be used or expended by or on behalf of the candidate.
- (b) Any contribution received by a candidate or by the campaign treasurer or a deputy campaign treasurer of a candidate after the date at which the candidate withdraws his or her candidacy, or after the date the candidate is defeated, becomes unopposed, or is elected to office must be returned to the person or committee contributing it and may not be used or expended by or on behalf of the candidate. . . .

- (7) (b) Any person who knowingly and willfully makes or accepts two or more contributions in violation of subsection (1) or subsection (5) commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. If any corporation, partnership, or other business entity or any political party, affiliated party committee, political committee, or electioneering communications organization is convicted of knowingly and willfully violating any provision punishable under this paragraph, it shall be fined not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$50,000. If it is a domestic entity, it may be ordered dissolved by a court of competent jurisdiction; if it is a foreign or nonresident business entity, its right to do business in this state may be forfeited. Any officer, partner, agent, attorney, or other representative of a corporation, partnership, or other business entity, or of a political committee, political party, affiliated party committee, or electioneering communications organization, or organization exempt from taxation under s. 527 or s. 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code, who aids, abets, advises, or participates in a violation of any provision punishable under this paragraph commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (8) Except when otherwise provided in subsection (7), any person who knowingly and willfully violates any provision of this section shall, in addition to any other penalty prescribed by this chapter, pay to the state a sum equal to twice the amount contributed in violation of this chapter. Each campaign treasurer shall pay all amounts contributed in violation of this section to the state for deposit in the General Revenue Fund. . . .

# Section 106.11, Florida Statutes - Expenses of and expenditures by candidates and political committees:

A treasurer must make expenditures from funds on deposit and only by bank checks or debit cards. Checks must include the signature of the treasurer, exact purpose for expenditure, and payee. The check signer is responsible for completeness, accuracy, and ensuring it is authorized.

A candidate who withdraws his candidacy, becomes unopposed, is eliminated, or is elected may spend funds to purchase "thank you" advertising within 75 days, to pay for previously obligated items, to close the campaign and prepare final reports, and to dispose of surplus funds as provided in F.S. § 106.141.

A candidate who makes and reports a loan to the campaign may reimburse himself for the loan at any time the account has sufficient funds and satisfy its outstanding obligations.

#### Section 106.141, Florida Statutes - Disposition of surplus funds by candidates:

A candidate who withdraws his candidacy, becomes unopposed, is eliminated, or is elected must dispose of surplus funds and file a final report within 90 days. Prior to disposing surplus funds, he may reimburse himself for any loan he made to the campaign account.

If a candidate receives a refund check after all surplus funds are disposed, he must file an amended report showing the refund and its method of disposition.

The disposition of surplus funds must be done in one or more of the following ways:

- Returned to each contributor on a pro rata basis;
- Donated to an IRS-designated 501(c)(3) organization;
- Up to \$25,000 may be given to the affiliated party committee or political party to which the candidate belongs; or
- If the candidate is for municipal office, to the municipality for deposit in its general fund.

A successful municipal candidate may also transfer up to \$5,000 multiplied by the number of years in the term of office to an "office account."

Office accounts must be separate from any personal or other account. They may only be used for legitimate expenses related to holding office, including:

- travel expenses incurred by the officer or a staff member;
- personal taxes payable on the office account;
- CPA or attorney fees for preparing the official's financial disclosure form;
- certain holiday card or newsletter costs;
- fees or dues to a religious, civic, or charitable organization to which the official belongs;
- items of modest value such as flowers and greeting cards for a constituent special event;
- personal expenses incurred by attending certain meetings; and
- costs of operating the official's office including employment of additional staff.

Office account reports must be made each calendar quarter until the account is closed. Such reports must reflect the payee's name and address, amount, and payment purpose, and the official must certify them as true and correct and file them with the qualifying officer.

A candidate required to dispose of surplus funds per this section must do so and report the disposition within 90 days of withdrawal, elimination, or election, including:

- The name and address of each person to whom funds were distributed and amounts;
- The name and address of each person to whom an expenditure was made, amounts, and purposes; and
- The amount transferred to an office account and the name and address of the financial institution holding the account.

The candidate and treasurer must sign and certify such a report as true and correct.

Any successful candidate who transfers surplus campaign funds to an office account must file a report on the tenth day following the end of each calendar quarter until the account is closed. The information must include the name and address of each person to whom any disbursement was made, the amounts, and the purposes, and the name and address of

any person from whom the candidate received any refund or reimbursement and the amount. The candidate must sign and certify as true and correct any such report, made on a form prescribed by the Florida Division of Elections.

The failure to properly dispose of surplus campaign funds is a first-degree misdemeanor.

Section 106.19, Florida Statutes - Violations by candidates, persons connected with campaigns, and political committees:

It is a first degree misdemeanor to accept an excessive contribution, fail to report any contribution required to be reported, falsely report or deliberately fail to include required information, or make or authorize any prohibited expenditure.

#### INDIVIDUAL AND ENTITY COVERED IN THIS REPORT

#### Rex Hardin

Rex Hardin first became a City of Pompano Beach commissioner in 1998 and served a two-year term. He was elected again as a commissioner in 2007 and re-elected to that office until November 2018, when he was elected mayor. While he used a campaign treasurer during two of his earlier campaigns, he acted as his own treasurer for the remaining campaigns, including the campaigns at issue in this report and the campaign at issue in our prior report of Mayor Hardin's campaign finance misconduct.<sup>4</sup>

He has owned and managed Cypress Printing Center, Inc., since 1984. He has been its sole employee during all times relevant to this report.

#### Cypress Printing Center, Inc.

According to the Florida Secretary of State Division of Corporations, Cypress Printing Center, Inc., is a Florida for profit corporation that was originally incorporated in 1984. Rex Hardin has been the registered agent and a director of the corporation since its inception. Its principal place of business is in Pompano Beach.

#### **INVESTIGATION**

#### **Investigation Overview**

This investigation was predicated on an allegation that Mayor Hardin failed to report campaign expenditures during his mayoral campaign for the November 2018 election.<sup>5</sup> Our investigation

substantiated that the official engaged in campaign finance misconduct by failing to properly dispose of the surplus funds in both his commissioner re-election and mayoral election campaigns, by accepting excessive contributions or improperly reporting in-kind contributions from himself or both, and by willfully certifying as true reports that he knew were incorrect. We also found errors, including the failure to report campaign contributions and expenditures, in the CTRs that he filed for the campaigns.

During the investigation, the OIG analyzed documents including the mayor's November 2018 prequalifying and qualifying documents, CTRs, and amended CTRs filed for his campaign to be elected mayor and for his campaign to be re-elected commissioner. The OIG also reviewed the campaign treasury records, bank records, and office account records. Finally, we interviewed Mayor Hardin, who served as his own treasurer in both campaigns.

#### Hardin's Two November 2018 Campaigns

On October 9, 2017, Mayor Hardin filed prequalifying documents, including a Form DS-DE 9 Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates, for election to the office of Pompano Beach city mayor in the November 6, 2018, election. (Composite Exhibit 1) He appointed himself as the campaign treasurer and ultimately designated Bank of America as his mayoral campaign's depository. Prequalifying documents included a Florida Secretary of State Division of Elections Statement of Candidate form confirming that he was provided access to, read, and understood the requirements of Chapter 106, Florida Statutes. On October 17, 2017, he opened a campaign account with Bank of America titled, "Rex Hardin," which he used for his mayoral campaign contributions and expenditures. He filed his qualifying documents on June 18, 2018, during the qualifying period of June 18 to June 22, 2018.

On April 16, 2018, without withdrawing his candidacy for mayor, Mayor Hardin filed prequalifying documents, including a new DS-DE 9, for re-election to the office of Pompano Beach city commissioner for district 3 in the same election cycle. (Composite Exhibit 2) Florida law prohibits a candidate from qualifying for more than one office; <sup>6</sup> however, it does not prohibit electioneering for two or more offices at one time, prior to qualifying deadlines.

Mayor Hardin appointed himself as the campaign treasurer and designated Bank of America as the campaign depository. On April 17, 2018, he opened a second campaign account with Bank of America titled, "Rex Hardin Campaign Election Committee - Campaign Account." He used this particular account for his commissioner campaign contributions and expenditures.

He formally withdrew from the campaign for commissioner on May 21, 2018, prior to the qualifying period. (Exhibit 3) The commissioner campaign account remained active until July 31, 2018, when the candidate withdrew the balance of the account through a \$2,893 check payable to the mayoral campaign and deposited it into the mayoral campaign account.

He was the successful candidate in the November 2018 election and became the city mayor.

# Hardin Engaged in Misconduct by Improperly Transferring the Balance of his Commissioner Campaign Account to the Mayoral Campaign Account

During our investigation, we determined that Mayor Hardin engaged in misconduct by failing to properly dispose of the surplus funds in his commissioner campaign account when he withdrew from the commissioner race in May 2018.

Section 106.021(1)(a), Florida Statutes, and the Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook direct how a candidate can properly change the office for which he is running. Specifically, the candidate must file a "new Form DS-DE 9 and a written statement indicating the change with the filing officer." Indeed, Form DS-DE 9 includes a section in which the filer is to select whether he or she is filing the form for the first time or is refiling the form for the purpose of changing the designation of the office.

As explained above, in October 2017, Mayor Hardin filed his papers to run for mayor. During his interview with the OIG, he explained that it was always his intention to run for mayor once the seat became available. However, he did not want to risk missing the deadline for running for reelection as commissioner if the incumbent mayor did not resign. Thus, on April 16, 2018, Mayor Hardin filed a new form DS-DE 9 indicating that the form was an initial filing to run for city commissioner.

Notably, he did not seek to change the designation of the office for which he already filed, that is, he did not change the office for which he was running. Instead, Mayor Hardin campaigned for both the mayoral seat and the commissioner seat simultaneously until May 21, 2018, when he formally withdrew from the campaign for commissioner. Although it was not unlawful to campaign for two seats simultaneously prior to qualifying, by withdrawing from the commissioner campaign, Sections 106.11(5) and 106.141, Florida Statutes, limited how Mayor Hardin could spend or dispose of the funds in his commission campaign account.

Upon withdrawal, he could have spent the contributed funds to purchase "thank you" advertising within 75 days, paid for previously obligated items, paid for items necessary to close the campaign office and prepare final campaign reports, and disposed of surplus funds and reported the same within 90 days.

He could have disposed of surplus funds by any combination of the following:

- By reimbursing himself for any loans he may have made to the campaign,
- By returning a prorated share to each contributor,
- By donating the funds to a qualifying charitable organization,
- By giving up to \$25,000 of the funds to the political party to which he belonged, and
- By depositing the funds into the city's general fund.

But Mayor Hardin chose none of the approved disposition methods.

Instead, upon withdrawing from the commissioner race, Mayor Hardin offered his donors a return of their prorated contribution, and when all but one declined, he wrote a check dated July 31, 2018, for the surplus of \$2,893 and deposited it into his mayoral campaign account. The check's memo read, "Transfer to mayor acct." (Exhibit 4) He reported this as a July 31, 2018, expenditure on his commissioner campaign TR CTR, which he filed on November 28, 2018. (Exhibit 5) He listed the contributors of those funds on the original M7 CTR in the mayoral account, dating each of the contributions July 31, 2019. (Exhibit 6)

Had he, in April 2018, filed a DS-DE 9 form changing the designation from mayor to commissioner instead of starting a second campaign and engaging in two campaigns and holding open two campaign accounts at the same time, Section 106.021, Florida Statutes, would have controlled the disposition of his mayoral and then commission campaign funds. Under that section, the law would have allowed the candidate to (1) offer to return contributions to the mayoral campaign on a pro rata basis and transfer remaining surplus funds into his commissioner campaign account and then (2) when switching back to run for mayor, he could have offered to return contributions to the commissioner campaign and transferred the remaining surplus funds back to the mayoral campaign account.

But his choice to run two campaigns simultaneously precluded his ability to transfer contributions from one account to another.

Mayor Hardin told the OIG that he believed the transfer of funds from his commission campaign to his mayoral campaign complied with the statutes. He claimed that his attorney, whom he named, advised him that he was permitted to transfer funds from one campaign to another in the same jurisdiction, as both seats were considered commission seats. He also said that, after withdrawing from the commissioner campaign, he sought advice about how to accomplish transferring the contributions from the commission campaign to the mayoral campaign, but he said he could not remember who advised him how to do that.

Mayor Hardin declined to waive his attorney-client communication privilege so that we could interview his attorney and corroborate his account, but he did offer and then transmitted an email thread between him and his attorney regarding the purported advice. Nonetheless, this email did not support Mayor Hardin's account. In fact, it strengthened our finding that he knowingly violated the law.

Six weeks after he filed his prequalifying papers in the second (commissioner) campaign and eleven days after he withdrew from that race, Mayor Hardin, in a June 1, 2018, email, titled, "Quick Question," asked his attorney:

What is the Statute that deals with campaign contributions if you *change the office you are running for*? Or is it gone? It used to be that if you had received campaign contributions to run for office but then *changed your mind to run for a different office* you could send a letter to your contributors asking if they wanted their pro

rata contribution back or would they like to roll it over to the new office that you are seeking. I have reviewed the current statutes but don't find the provision that deals with this. Can you direct me to the correct area of the Florida Statutes, if it exists?

(emphasis added) (Exhibit 7)

In reply, the attorney cited and provided F.S. § 106.021, a proper response given the fact that the candidate had asked him about the disposition of surplus campaign funds after *changing the office* for which he was running as opposed to simultaneously running for two different offices and *withdrawing* his candidacy in one of them. (Exhibit 7) The candidate's failure to properly dispose of the surplus funds in his commissioner campaign account amounted to a violation of F.S. § 106.141(11), a first degree misdemeanor.

# Hardin Engaged in Misconduct by Failing to Properly and Timely Dispose of the Surplus Funds in his Mayoral Campaign Account

We also determined that Mayor Hardin engaged in misconduct by failing to dispose of the surplus funds in his mayoral campaign account properly and timely. According to state law, the newly elected mayor had 90 days following the November 6, 2018, election to dispose of surplus funds in his campaign account, that is, on or by February 4, 2019.

According to the original termination (TR) CTR that he filed for his mayoral campaign account on February 7, 2019, he had transferred the campaign's surplus funds, \$5,737.70, into his office account. (Exhibit 8) But we determined that Mayor Hardin had not disposed of the surplus funds on or by February 7, 2019, the date of his TR CTR. According to the records of the bank holding the mayoral campaign treasury account, \$5,803.12 remained in the campaign account until August 8, 2019, nine months after the election and six months after the surplus funds disposal deadline. (Exhibit 9)

In fact, on July 16, 2019, the day before he was scheduled to give an interview to the OIG, Mayor Hardin filed an amended TR CTR, this time indicating that he had transferred a surplus amount of \$5,803.12 into his office account. (Exhibit 10) At his interview the next day, July 17, 2019, he informed us that, on the day before, he wrote two checks from his mayoral campaign account. One \$750 check was to a charitable organization that he failed to report on any CTR, and the other moved the balance to his office account. Bank records corroborated this admission. (Exhibit 9)

He could not provide a reason for failing to dispose of the surplus funds on time, other than to suggest that it may have been due, in part, to a pending refund for an excessive contribution, which was also the subject of an FEC complaint that the agency advised it would be closing.<sup>10</sup>

Because Mayor Hardin willfully certified the correctness of the TR CTR knowing that it was incorrect, he violated F.S. § 106.07(5). His failure to properly dispose of the surplus funds in his mayoral campaign account amounted to another violation of section F.S. § 106.141(11). The

unreported July 16, 2019, donation to a charitable organization violated F.S. § 106.07. Each of these was a first-degree misdemeanor.

#### Other Reporting Issues in Hardin's Mayoral and Commissioner Campaigns

<u>Excessive In-Kind Contributions, Incorrect Reporting of In-Kind Contributions and Printing Expenditures, and Mischaracterized Loans</u>

During the OIG's review of the CTRs against the campaign's bank records and its own records, we discovered that the candidate failed to report or improperly reported certain expenditures and contributions to the campaign, as follows:

Once again, the candidate used his own company, Cypress Printing Services, Inc., to arrange for his campaign's printing.<sup>11</sup> The law considers a corporation to be a "person" separate from any individual who may own it or belong to it.<sup>12</sup> Contributions to local elections campaigns are limited to \$1,000 per person, and knowing and willful excessive contributions from corporations are penalized through fines of between \$10,000 and \$50,000.<sup>13</sup>

We inspected 15 Cypress Printing invoices from the campaign records that totaled \$17,751.45 (Composite Exhibit 11) and, after reviewing them against bank records and CTRs, noted serious errors with how Mayor Hardin reported this activity. OIG Appendix A summarizes the Cypress Printing invoices, when they were generated, for how much, when the campaign paid for the services billed on the invoices, and how the campaign reported the printing as expenditures, loans, and contributions.

At the outset, despite the fact that the instructions on the CTR form specifically direct filers to report the campaign's actual expenditures during the particular reporting period in which the expenditure occurred, Mayor Hardin did not do so. As he wrote six campaign checks to Cypress Printing between March 1, 2018, and November 23, 2018, he should have contemporaneously reported six expenditures, one for each check, on the appropriate, corresponding original CTRs.

Instead, Mayor Hardin reported on various CTRs and amended CTRs that his campaign paid Cypress Printing for printing on 15 occasions on 14 different dates between March 1, 2018, and November 23, 2018. Mayor Hardin told us that, during the campaign, he did not have time to prepare the Cypress Printing invoices for the campaign. After the election, when he had time, he generated the final eleven of the 15 invoices on November 29, 2018, with a notation of the actual date the goods and services were provided.

We noted that Mayor Hardin did not report most of these expenditures until November 1, 2018, and he did not invoice most of them (as Cypress Printing) until November 29, 2018. When we cross-referenced the campaign's bank records, we discovered that he only wrote one check on the mayoral campaign account for ten of these invoices for \$4,066.95 on October 29, 2018. (Composite Exhibit 12) Mayor Hardin wrote this check one month before Cypress Printing even issued the corresponding invoices. The candidate should have reported this check as one expenditure on the appropriate, original CTR in October 2018.

Furthermore, and more disturbingly, we determined that Mayor Hardin improperly reported \$5,601.60 in contributions as in-kind contributions from himself (after first reporting most of these as loans, as we explain below). Thirteen of the invoices included handwritten notations that helped to explain corresponding contribution entries in the CTRs. For example, invoice number 22075, dated September 25, 2018, showed a charge of \$2,258.88 for 500 campaign signs, 500 stakes, and sales tax. The campaign's copy of the invoice reflected the following, undated handwritten notations:

\$1800.38 – Paid From Campaign \$458.50 – INK From Rex Hardin

Inv. 22075 & 22076 Paid Check #1028

(Composite Exhibit 11)

Invoice number 22076, dated September 25, 2018, showed a charge of \$2,345.54 for 50 large campaign signs and sales tax. The campaign's copy of this invoice reflected the following handwritten notations:

\$1745.54 – Paid From Campaign \$600.00 – INK From Rex Hardin

Inv. #22076 & 22075 Paid ck. #1028

(Composite Exhibit 11)

Indeed, we determined that the campaign reported a \$3,545.92 expenditure to Cypress Printing on the G4 CTR, which represented the campaign's combined payment on invoices 22075 and 22076. (Exhibit 13)

But Mayor Hardin subsequently reported on an amended G4 CTR, which he filed on February 7, 2019, the unpaid \$458.50 from invoice 22075 and the unpaid \$600.00 from invoice 22076—the difference between the amounts invoiced and the amounts paid —as inkind contributions from himself on September 25, 2018. (Exhibit 14) The handwritten notations on thirteen of the 15 invoices, which reflected a total of \$5,601.60 in reductions, all

corresponded with in-kind contributions that Mayor Hardin reported as having personally contributed to the campaign on CTRs.

We were particularly troubled to ascertain that Mayor Hardin initially reported nine of these thirteen expenditures to Cypress Printing as payments in full for the amounts billed on nine invoices, only to later amend the expenditures to reduce them to the amounts indicated in the handwritten notations. At the same time that he reported the full expenditures, he also reported loans from himself to the campaign in amounts corresponding to the handwritten notations on the invoices.

At no time did Mayor Hardin write a personal check to the campaign account or Cypress Printing or otherwise make any monetary loan to the campaign for the amounts that corresponded to the exact amounts noted on the invoices as "in-kind contributions," which he initially reported on September 13, 2018, and November 1, 2018, as loans, and then characterized as in-kind contributions for the first time on February 7, 2019. (OIG Appendix A)

When we interviewed him, he insisted that the in-kind contributions were personally from him and not from Cypress Printing. He said he did not recall how he calculated the portion of each invoice that he identified as an in-kind contribution or even whether the calculation was related to cost or profit. He said he did not know how much profit Cypress Printing made from the sale of goods and services to the campaign and that he was not sure if he could calculate the exact cost or profit.

In-kind contributions are contributions having an attributable monetary value in any form, made for the purpose of influencing the results of an election or making an electioneering communication, but they do not include services from individuals who volunteer a portion of or all of their time on behalf of a candidate.<sup>14</sup> Thus, to the extent that the candidate reported the unpaid portions of the invoices as in-kind contributions from himself, he improperly characterized the \$5,601.60 as his in-kind contributions where he, personally, did not provide the campaign with anything of value, other than his services, to influence the results of the election. If the unpaid portions should not have been reported as contributions, the candidate's true total contributions and expenditures were misreported, the total contributions from all donors appearing \$5,601.60 higher and the expenditures to all vendors appearing \$5,601.60 lower than what they should have been.<sup>15</sup>

The reductions from the amounts that the campaign paid to Cypress Printing, reflected on the invoices and CTRs as "INK from Rex Hardin," were excessive and unreported contributions from a corporation, incorrectly reported as loans and contributions from the candidate, or both. As explained in *Division of Elections Opinion 86-15* (Sept. 8, 1986), "The singular fact that a corporation is majority-owned by a candidate does not convert the corporate entity into candidate status for the purpose of avoiding the contribution limits imposed by law." At all relevant times, Cypress Printing Center, Inc., was an active Florida profit corporation. While Mayor Hardin, as the candidate, was at liberty to make unlimited contributions to his own campaign, his company was limited to contributing \$1,000—in-kind or otherwise. Accordingly, to the extent that the unpaid portions of Cypress Printing's invoices amounted to in-kind contributions from the company, the company's contributions exceeded the maximum allowed by law by \$4,601.60.

In order to avoid violating the contribution maximum allowed by law, and to properly certify the CTRs as Mayor Hardin filed them, the candidate's only legal avenue was to have personally paid Cypress Printing the value of the invoices' reductions. However, he did not. He confirmed to the OIG that he did not personally reimburse or pay Cypress Printing for any of the \$5,601.60.

Making or accepting multiple contributions in excess of the maximum allowed by law comprise third-degree felonies. The willful certifications of CTRs as true and correct when they are not are first-degree misdemeanors.

#### Errors in the Mayoral Campaign's CTRs

Our review of the CTRs that Mayor Hardin filed for his mayoral campaign between November 9, 2017, and February 7, 2019, revealed a number of incorrect entries in reporting. Although we intended to discuss them with him during our interview, at the interview, he explained that he filed another round of amended CTRs, including an amended TR CTR for his mayoral campaign, a day earlier, that is, on July 16, 2019. Indeed, these amended CTRs corrected some of the errors we identified. However, some still remained. We discuss several of them below. <sup>16</sup>

Duplicate Reporting and Duplicate Payment of Expenditures to Cypress Printing

As reported above, Mayor Hardin improperly reported a reduction of invoice number 22075 as an in-kind contribution to himself personally. Our review of invoice number 22075 and its handwritten notations determined that the candidate also reported the full \$2,258.88 invoiced amount as a separate expenditure on the TR CTR, a duplicate of

what he previously reported. (Composite Exhibit 11) He did not file an amended CTR correcting this error. <sup>17</sup>

Moreover, the CTRs originally identified 15 expenditures to Cypress Printing occurring on 14 different dates between March 1, 2018, and November 23, 2018, totaling \$16,472.07. (OIG Appendix A) Mayor Hardin later amended the expenditures to match the amounts noted on the invoices as the campaign's portion. Thus, he ultimately reported \$12,149.85 in expenditures to Cypress Printing. However, bank records showed that the campaign issued six campaign checks to Cypress Printing totaling \$12,629.07, or \$479.22 more than what the CTRs finally reported. (Composite Exhibit 12) A review of these circumstances suggested that the campaign erroneously paid invoice 22088 twice: once with check number 1044 and a second time with check number 1048. Mayor Hardin ultimately corrected this error. Updated bank records reflected Cypress Printing Service's \$479.22 payment back to the campaign on July 12, 2019, five days before the mayor's interview with our office, correcting the error.

#### Amended TR CTR Calculation Errors

In addition to the errors discussed above, we noted that the (amended) TR CTR reported a cumulative total of \$94,933 in monetary contributions to, and expenditures from, the mayoral campaign account. However, these figures did not match the campaign's bank records, which reflected deposits of \$94,644.50 into the account between the date of the first deposit on October 17, 2017, and July 10, 2019—\$288.50 less than reported on the amended TR CTR.

We noted that two deposits were made into the mayoral campaign account after the closing date for the campaign treasury's July 2019 statement—one for \$479.22 and one for \$10.05, for refunds and reimbursements, respectively, that were not reported on any CTR.

The campaign's bank records also did not reconcile with the reported expenditures on the amended TR CTR. Specifically, although the amended TR CTR reported \$94,933 in expenditures from the campaign account, bank statements showed that, between the date of the first expenditure on December 6, 2017, and February 4, 2019, the end of the amended TR CTR reporting period, the campaign only spent \$88,580.65. Of course, we note that the campaign's amended TR CTR reported \$5,803.12 that was transferred to the office account—but that transfer did not happen until August 8, 2019. Even if Mayor Hardin had properly transferred this money, the expenditures would still only have amounted to \$94,383.77, that is, \$549.23 short of what he reported on the CTRs.

#### Late Filing of the TR CTR for Mayor Hardin's Commissioner Campaign Account

Finally, we noted that Mayor Hardin's TR CTR for his commissioner campaign account was not timely. Specifically, the candidate filed just two CTRs for his campaign to be re-elected commissioner, the M4 CTR, which he filed on May 10, 2018, and the TR CTR, which he filed November 28, 2018. Although Mayor Hardin received campaign contributions in May 2018, he did not file an M5 CTR in June 2018, as required. Instead, he reported the commissioner campaign's May 2018 activity in the TR CTR.

Because he withdrew from the commissioner's race on May 21, 2108, he had 90 days to properly dispose of the funds and file a TR CTR, that is, until August 20, 2018. He did not file the TR CTR until November 28, 2018, more than three months late.

#### **INTERVIEW SUMMARY**

As a part of the investigation, OIG Special Agents conducted several interviews. The statements made in the significant interviews are summarized below.

#### Interviews of Rex Hardin

Mayor Hardin was first elected to the city commission in 1998 and served until 2000. He was elected again to the commission in 2007 and served continuous two-year terms until November 2018, when he was elected to fill the remaining two years of the former mayor's four-year term ending in November 2020.

He has launched at least six campaigns during his political career. Except for two of his earliest campaigns, he served as his own campaign treasurer. He was familiar with the state campaign laws and the Florida Division of Elections (DOE) Candidate and Campaign Treasurer Handbook. Although he did not recall reviewing the handbook prior to the 2018 campaigns, he characterized his understanding of the treasurer's legal responsibilities as "fair."

He opened two campaign accounts, one for his 2018 mayoral campaign, and one for his 2018 campaign to be re-elected to the city commission. For each of these, he served as the sole campaign treasurer. He completed all the CTRs, was the sole signatory on the accounts, made all the contribution deposits, and signed all the campaign checks.

While the incumbent city mayor's term was not set to expire until November 2020, he (the incumbent) had expressed interest in running for county commissioner. Because then-city Commissioner Hardin was interested in pursuing the city mayoral seat, if available, he opened his mayoral campaign account in October 2017. It was unknown if, or when, the incumbent mayor would file to formally qualify for election to the county commission, at which point he would have to resign as city mayor.

Because there was uncertainty about whether the incumbent would vacate his mayoral seat, in April 2018, Mayor Hardin decided to also announce his candidacy for re-election to his District 3 city commission seat. He did not notify the city clerk that he was ending his mayoral

campaign because he was not ending the campaign. If the mayor resigned to run for county commission, he (Hardin) would continue the mayoral campaign; if not, he would withdraw from the mayoral campaign and pursue re-election to the city commission. A short time later, the incumbent mayor formalized his intention to run for county commission and, in May 2018, Mayor Hardin ended his campaign for city commissioner.

At that time, he sent out letters to all the commission contributors notifying them that he was ending the campaign and that they had the option of receiving their contribution back or allowing it to roll over to the mayoral campaign. Eventually, he rolled all but one contribution to the mayoral campaign.

He filed his CTRs by mail, personal delivery to the city clerk's office, and via e-mail on at least one occasion. At the time of the interview, the OIG was aware of 36 CTRs, 21 of which were amended CTRs. The amendments were necessary due to a variety of errors and omissions that he had made. When a mistake on a CTR was discovered, it could result in several subsequent CTRs having to be amended. He filed several amended CTRs in February 2019, contemporaneous with filing the termination (TR) CTR.

Mayor Hardin explained that, in addition, on July 16, 2019, <sup>18</sup> he filed at least five amended reports, including an amended TR CTR, for the mayoral campaign. His review of his CTR filings was precipitated by two complaints filed with the FEC. Since learning of the FEC's inquiries, he has reviewed all his CTR filings and believed the amended CTRs corrected all the CTR errors.

One of the FEC complaints was related to contributions received from Mt. Vernon Property Holdings. Mt Vernon contributed \$500 and later contributed \$1,000 to the mayoral campaign. Mayor Hardin noticed the overage and contacted the FEC to find out how to remedy it. They advised him to refund the overage and file an amended report reflecting the refund, which he did. However, shortly after he filed the CTR reporting the initial contributions and the clerk published it, someone filed a complaint with the FEC alleging that the candidate accepted excess contributions from Mt. Vernon.

Although Mayor Hardin mailed Mt. Vernon a refund check and letter, he later realized that the company did not cash the refund check. FEC staff advised him to account for the outstanding refund check and amend the respective CTR, which he did. 19

Other than his elected position, Mayor Hardin's only other occupation has been as owner and sole employee of Cypress Printing Center, Inc. The campaign purchased print products and services from Cypress Printing.

Several of the invoices Mayor Hardin supplied to the OIG included a notation that a portion of each invoice was an in-kind contribution to the campaign and the in-kind contributions were

reported on the respective CTRs. The in-kind contributions were personally from him, not Cypress Printing. Mayor Hardin recalled that he initially reported some of the Cypress Printing expenditures and in-kind contributions incorrectly but that the amended CTRs he recently filed should have corrected the errors, including an approximately \$479 overpayment to Cypress Printing that had since been refunded to the campaign.

Mayor Hardin used his personal credit cards to make purchases for the campaign and reported the expenditures and reimbursements on the CTRs. While there may have been some errors or omissions in the reporting of the credit card purchases and reimbursements, the recently amended CTRs should have corrected any errors.

Mayor Hardin filed only two CTRs for the commission campaign, the M4 (for the reporting period of April 1, 2018, to April 30, 2018) and TR CTRs (May 1, 2018, to February 4, 2019). He did not file any amended reports for the commission campaign. Although the campaign accepted contributions in May 2018, Hardin had no explanation why he did not file an M5 CTR (May 1, 2018, to May 31, 2018) to report those contributions and instead reported them on the TR CTR. Mayor Hardin believed the due date for filing his commission TR CTR was in February 2019, and he was not familiar with a rule that required the TR CTR to be filed within 90 days of his withdrawal from the campaign.

He consulted attorney M.H. about opening his campaign for commissioner and having simultaneous campaigns and campaign accounts for two municipal elected offices. Although the mayor did not recall how he phrased the question, M.H. informed him that it was permissible. Although he was not familiar with the specific requirements regarding the disposition of surplus funds, his understanding of M.H.'s advice was that he was allowed to transfer funds from one campaign to another in the same jurisdiction. It was his understanding that he would not be allowed to transfer the funds to a campaign for another level of government, such as state office. Accordingly, he believed the transfer of funds from his commission campaign to his mayoral campaign complied with the statutes.

After withdrawing from the commission campaign, he sought advice from someone, whose name he didn't recall, on how to accomplish transferring the contributions from the commission campaign to the mayoral campaign. He ultimately transferred the commission contributions to his mayoral account and identified the contributors and their contributions on the mayoral M7 CTR (for the reporting period of July 1, 2018, to July 31, 2018).

After the election, Hardin intended to donate a portion of the surplus mayoral campaign funds to charitable causes and transfer the balance to his office account, however, the account remained open until the day before the OIG's interview (July 16, 2019), when he wrote two checks from his mayoral campaign account. One \$750 check was to a charitable organization and the other effected the transfer of the balance to his office account, thereby, closing the account. Those were the only checks he had written on the account since filing the first TR CTR in February 2019. Mayor Hardin did not have a specific reason why he did not transfer the balance of the account before July 2019, but suggested it was in part because of the uncashed Mt. Vernon check and the pending disposition of the related FEC investigation.

He did not pay Cypress Printing any of the amounts he reported on CTRs as in-kind contributions from himself.

#### RESPONSES TO THE PRELIMINARY REPORT

In accordance with Section 10.01(D)(2)(a) of the Charter of Broward County, preliminary copies of this report were provided to the municipality and the implicated party for their discretionary written responses. The OIG did not receive a response from either the city or Mayor Hardin.

#### **CONCLUSION**

The OIG investigation substantiated that, during his campaigns for commissioner and mayor in the November 2018 election cycle, Mayor Hardin engaged in campaign finance misconduct in both of his campaign accounts.

With regard to his commissioner's campaign account, Mayor Hardin improperly transferred the contributions he received during his commissioner campaign into his mayoral campaign account. This option was not available to him as he did not change the designation of the office for which he was running when he decided to run for commissioner after filing prequalifying documents to run for mayor. He also failed to report treasury activity in the commissioner campaign after April 2018 until November 2018, when he filed his termination report, which was three months after the disposal and final reporting deadline set by law.

In addition, he falsely certified that, at the conclusion of his campaign to be elected mayor, he transferred the over \$5,000 in remaining funds in his mayoral campaign account to his mayoral office account when he had not. In fact, the funds remained in his mayoral campaign account until after July 16, 2019, five months after the disposal and reporting deadline.

We also found that Mayor Hardin used his own printing company, Cypress Printing, to provide campaign printing services to his mayoral election campaign. Cypress Printing invoiced the campaign a total of \$5,601.60 more than the campaign paid it. The candidate reported the \$5,601.60 as thirteen inkind contributions from himself when, if they were in-kind contributions, they came from the company and exceeded the \$1,000 maximum contribution allowed by law. Moreover, any volunteered services from the candidate could not constitute an in-kind contribution. Thus, these reported contributions either amounted to an excessive contribution or the candidate willfully certified the CTRs that reported them as true and correct when they were not. We also ascertained that Mayor Hardin originally reported as loans eleven of his "in-kind contributions," when he did not, in fact, make such loans.

We further found numerous other errors in the CTRs that the official filed for both campaigns, including the failure to properly report contributions and expenditures, the majority for which he filed amended CTRs the day before interviewing with our office.

Considering the campaign finance violations detailed here, in accordance with our charter mandate, we are again referring this matter to the Florida Election Commission and to the Broward State Attorney's Office for whatever action those agencies deem appropriate.

#### 106.021 Campaign treasurers; deputies; primary and secondary depositories.—

(1)(a) Each candidate for nomination or election to office and each political committee shall appoint a campaign treasurer. Each person who seeks to qualify for nomination or election to, or retention in, office shall appoint a campaign treasurer and designate a primary campaign depository before qualifying for office. Any person who seeks to qualify for election or nomination to any office by means of the petitioning process shall appoint a treasurer and designate a primary depository on or before the date he or she obtains the petitions. At the same time a candidate designates a campaign depository and appoints a treasurer, the candidate shall also designate the office for which he or she is a candidate. If the candidate is running for an office that will be grouped on the ballot with two or more similar offices to be filled at the same election, the candidate must indicate for which group or district office he or she is running. This subsection does not prohibit a candidate, at a later date, from changing the designation of the office for which he or she is a candidate. However, if a candidate changes the designated office for which he or she is a candidate, the candidate must notify all contributors in writing of the intent to seek a different office and offer to return pro rata, upon their request, those contributions given in support of the original office sought. This notification shall be given within 15 days after the filing of the change of designation and shall include a standard form developed by the Division of Elections for requesting the return of contributions. The notice requirement does not apply to any change in a numerical designation resulting solely from redistricting. If, within 30 days after being notified by the candidate of the intent to seek a different office, the contributor notifies the candidate in writing that the contributor wishes his or her contribution to be returned, the candidate shall return the contribution, on a pro rata basis, calculated as of the date the change of designation is filed. Up to a maximum of the contribution limits specified in s. 106.08, a candidate who runs for an office other than the office originally designated may use any contribution that a donor does not request be returned within the 30-day period for the newly designated office, provided the candidate disposes of any amount exceeding the contribution limit pursuant to the options in s.106.11(5)(b) and (c) or s. 106.141(4)(a)1., 2., or 4.; notwithstanding, the full amount of the contribution for the original office shall count toward the contribution limits specified in s. 106.08 for the newly designated office. A person may not accept any contribution or make any expenditure with a view to bringing about his or her nomination, election, or retention in public office, or authorize another to accept such contributions or make such expenditure on the person's behalf, unless such person has appointed a campaign treasurer and designated a primary campaign depository. A candidate for an office voted upon statewide may appoint not more than 15 deputy campaign treasurers, and any other candidate or political committee may appoint not more than 3 deputy campaign treasurers. The names and addresses of the campaign treasurer and deputy campaign treasurers so appointed shall be filed with the officer before whom such candidate is required to qualify or with whom such political committee is required to register pursuant to s. 106.03.

I have reviewed the current statutes but don't find the provision that deals with this.
