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An act relating to Broward County; renaming Broward County as Lauderdale County; providing for transition; providing construction; requiring a referendum;

directing the Division of Law Revision to prepare a reviser's bill for a specified purpose; providing legislative intent; providing effective dates.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Broward County, a political subdivision of this state as described in s. 7.06, Florida Statutes, is hereby renamed Lauderdale County.

Section 2. For a transitional period of no longer than 2 years after the effective date of this act, the county may continue doing business using "Broward County" as a fictitious name in order to provide sufficient time for the county to make the necessary name change on or to records, contracts, bonds, accounts, physical assets, and wherever else the county's name is <u>used.</u>

Section 3. The county's renaming under this act shall in no way affect any existing agreements, bonds, or other instruments of indebtedness, liabilities, assets, rights, or obligations of the county. All lawful debts, bonds, obligations, contracts, franchises, promissory notes, audits, minutes,
