Caryl Hattan Vice Mayor District 2 The Town of Davie is requesting a special act that would legislatively authorize the Town to install a sign at the Farm Park, a Town owned property. The site is located on the western edge of the Town of Davie, bordering I-75 to the west, Shotgun Road to the east, and SW 36th Street (South Post Road) to the South.

Susan Starkey Councilmember District 3 The 80-acre parcel is in the development phase and will celebrate Davie's agricultural history and will include local farming, livestock, an education center, a pavilion, stables, a riding arena, equestrian trails, a farmers' market, playground, and an overlook area.

Marlon Luis Councilmember District 4 The Town of Davie is pursuing approval from the Florida Legislature for the installation of a sign at a designated site. Florida Statute 479.024 only authorizes Signs on properties zoned for Commercial and Industrial use. The Farm Park is currently zoned agricultural, and Town does not desire to rezone the property to a commercial or industrial zoning district as it is not compatible with the surrounding area.

As such, the Town is requesting the Florida Legislature to approve the proposed sign installation on land that does not currently permit outdoor advertising, off-premises signage and/or billboards per local, county or state law (Florida Statutes 479).

If approved, it is anticipated that the Town could see revenues of approximately \$300,000 to \$500,000 annually, which will be earmarked solely for the operations at the Farm Park.

The Town firmly believes that this sign will deliver substantial benefits to the community by effectively promoting local activities, disseminating public safety announcements, issuing emergency notifications, and displaying vital weather and amber alerts. We are committed to maintaining high standards and will enforce strict restrictions to prohibit any advertisements that encourage unlawful behavior, contain obscenity, are sexually explicit, promote hate, endorse violence or discrimination, or violate accepted moral standards.

To ensure that residents living within 1,000 feet of the proposed project had a clear opportunity to express their views, the Town successfully hosted a community meeting to gather feedback. Furthermore, the Town provided a comment period to accommodate any further input, objections, or feedback. No comments were received in objection to the local bill.

The Town's proposed local bill is being sponsored by State Representative Michael Gottlieb, District 102. There are no previous legislative requests related to this property or project.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF DAVIE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR TO SUBMIT A LOCAL BILL TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA LEGISLATURE THROUGH THE BROWARD LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF A DOUBLE-FACED DIGITAL BILLBOARD AT THE FARM PARK; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie is proposing the implementation of a digital billboard at the Farm Park, a Town owned property located on the western edge of the Town of Davie, bordering I-75 on the west, Shotgun Road on the east, and SW 36th Street (South Post Road) on the South;

WHEREAS, the Farm Park is an 80-acre parcel in the development phase that will celebrate Davie's agricultural history and will include local farming, livestock, an education center, a pavilion, stables, a riding arena, equestrian trails, a farmers' market, playground, and an overlook area;

WHEREAS, the digital billboard will be located on the Farm Park expansion property which is a agriculturally zoned;

WHEREAS, the Town does not want to rezone the property to a commercial or industrial zoning district as it is not compatible with the surrounding area;

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie is seeking the State of Florida Legislature's approval for the proposed digital billboard installation on land that does not currently permit outdoor advertising, off-premises signage and/or billboards per local, county or state law (Florida Statutes 479);

WHEREAS, permitting this billboard will not change the restrictions in the Town of Davie's billboard Code of Ordinances that prohibits additional billboards in the Town of Davie;

WHEREAS, the anticipated revenue generated by the billboard will be earmarked for the sole purpose of operations at the Farm Park;

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie envisions this billboard will provide significant benefits for the Town including promoting Town activities, public safety announcements, emergency notifications, displaying weather and amber alerts;

WHEREAS, the Town will impose advertising restrictions that would prohibit advertisement that promotes unlawful activity, contains obscene, sexually explicit, or hate based material, endorses violence or discrimination, or violates moral turpitude;

WHEREAS, the proposed sign will be located over 1,000 feet from any residential property with the sign face directed solely along the I-75 corridor;

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2025, the Town disseminated a community meeting public meeting notice to the residential properties within 1,000 ft of the proposed site of the billboard;

WHEREAS, the community meeting was held on September 30, 2025, to elicit community input;

WHEREAS, after the meeting was held, residents were also afforded an additional seven days to provide comments, objections, and feedback on the proposed billboard;

WHEREAS, no objections were received; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Davie is proceeding with the State Local consideration of the digital billboard at the Farm Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF DAVIE, FLORIDA THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. Legislative Findings/Recitals. The above recitals are hereby adopted by the Town Council of the Town of Davie as its legislative findings relative to the subjects and matters set forth in this Resolution.

Section 2. The Town Council of the Town of Davie does hereby approve the Town Administrator to submit a local bill to the State of Florida Legislature through the Broward Legislative Delegation for the approval of a double-faced digital billboard at the Farm Park on land that does not currently permit outdoor advertising, off-premises signage and/or billboards per local, county or state law (Florida Statutes 479).

<u>Section 3</u>. Severability. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, it is the intent of the Town Council that such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and, to this end, the provisions of this Resolution are declared severable.

<u>Section 4.</u> Conflicts. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 5</u>. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
