Central County has been selected as one of the first Healthy Community Zones (HCZ) by the Broward Regional Health Planning Council's (BRHPC) Transforming Our Community's Health (TOUCH) partnership initiative. The designation will focus on the neighborhoods of Roosevelt Gardens, Washington Park, Boulevard Gardens and Franklin Park.

It will provide opportunities to partner and collaborate with leading community organizations in order to create a shared vision of health, economic development and education and propose the implementation of community improvements. The four focus areas include: Tobacco Free Living, Active Living and Healthy Eating, Healthy and Safe Physical Environments, and Clinical and Community Linkages. A Health Fair and Healthy Community Zone Kick-Off is being held on **November 7th from 11 AM to 2 PM** at Delevoe Park.

INVESTING IN OUR FUTURE, IMPROVING OUR COMMUNITIES

Broward County has increased code enforcement efforts to promote safety and pride of ownership within the Broward Municipal Services District (BMSD) neighborhoods. Community code enforcement staff is working with home and business owners, landlords and renters to highlight common code violations and how they can be corrected.

To ensure that the communities are aware of this effort, Broward County, in collaboration with neighborhood leaders and other community partners, began a public outreach campaign on July 13th. Code enforcement officers began issuing courtesy notices to homeowners, business owners, renters and landlords alerting them of any code violations on their properties. The courtesy notice provides 30 days to correct the violation without fines or enforcement action. If the violations are not corrected within 30 days, enforcement will be initiated.

Common code violations include:

Overgrown lawns; vehicles that are inoperable and/or missing tags, plates or windows; parking or vehicle storage on unpaved surfaces; storage of junk, trash and debris on property; and illegal dumping.



Broward County's Planning and Development Management Division is drafting amendments to the County's Zoning Code (Code). Changes are proposed to update the lists of the various zoning districts, add special exception uses, delete zoning districts no longer used and conform to recent case law. Staff expects to present the proposed changes to the Central County Community Advisory Board at its next meeting on November 18, 2015 at 6PM at the Franklin Park Community Center. NEW PARK IMPROVEMENTS

An expansion project recently approved by the Broward County Board of County Commissioners for Reverend Samuel Delevoe Memorial Park is underway. The expansion area is south of the Urban League of Broward County and the African-American Research Library and Cultural Center. The project will include green space and 71 parking spaces, five of which are handicapped-accessible. A new 36-foot-by-36-foot picnic shelter is being constructed, along with a community garden.

Another planned improvement is the Dillard Green Space Artwork Project that includes construction of a parking lot, jogging/walk path, solar lights, exercise stations and landscaping.
