Working together to clean up and beautify the BMSD!

Partnering with residents, community groups, Civic Associations/HOAs and BMSD leaders, Broward County continues to focus on improving the quality of life in the BMSD. The Public Works, Code Compliance and Solid Waste and Recycling Divisions are working to enhance the efficiency of services and make your neighborhood safer, healthier and aesthetically pleasing.

The Litter Collection Truck



Keeping our community clean just got a major upgrade. A new, state-of-the-art litter collection truck is now on the road, helping crews more efficiently remove debris from neighborhoods throughout the BMSD.

The modern, high-capacity vehicle uses powerful vacuum technology and its own independent power system to quickly collect litter, leaves, and yard debris from the rights-of-way, swales, and other open spaces. The equipment allows crews to cover more ground while reducing the amount of manual handling required.

In addition to daily operations, the truck will play an important role in storm cleanup, helping teams respond more quickly after severe weather. Operating five days a week, the unit collects debris that is then transported to the County's Central Residential Drop-Off Center in Davie.

This new addition strengthens our ongoing commitment to keeping the community clean, safe, and well maintained.

Since January 12, 2026 there has been **2.365 tons** of litter collected and **1.245 tons** of miscellaneous small bulky items collected by the truck.
