Our annual Community Cleanup is scheduled for Saturday, April 2nd. Adults and children of all ages are urged to volunteer. Please plan to arrive at Sunview Park at 8:30AM. The County will provide gloves, safety vests, trash bags and trash pickers, as well as t-shirts and other fun gifts for each participant. Small teams will be assigned to various locations in our community to pick up litter from 9AM to 12PM. Refreshments will be served at the park after.

This is a great project for scout troops and students in need of community service hours. A large dumpster for bulk trash will be placed on SW 18th Street on the south side of the park. Bring tree limbs, yard clippings, paint, insecticide and other hazardous materials. A clam truck will also pick up bulk items throughout the community.

Are You Seeing Dots?



It's all about the Dot **Yellow Dot**

It could help save your life!

The Yellow Dot Program assists Broward County residents and first responders in the event of a medical emergency involving the participant's vehicle or motorcycle. The Yellow Dot sticker / decal placed in the rear windshield or a visible location on a motorcycle indicates to law enforcement, emergency responders, and other medical personnel that a completed Yellow Dot pamphlet is in the glove compartment. The Yellow Dot pamphlet provides life-saving information such as the participant's current medical conditions, medications, allergies, physician's name and phone number, and emergency contact's name and phone number.
