Video Camera System Coming Soon

Broward County initiated the acquisition and installation of a Public Safety Security Camera system within the Broward Sheriff's Office Central Zone, which includes the Central County and Broadview Park neighborhoods. Cameras will record public areas, but will not be actively monitored. The purpose of the cameras is to deter crime and help with investigations.



Are You Ready. Set. Safe?

Many have long forgotten the impacts of Hurricane Irma in September 2017. Although South Florida did not receive sustained hurricane force winds and homes did not incur extensive damages, the storm brought three tornadoes, extensive damages to trees and fences, and 33 indirect deaths that occurred before, during, and after the storm. Text 911

Call if you can, text only if you can't is the latest improvement in Broward County's 911 system. Launched in April 2019 as part of a \$353 million investment approved by the Board of County Commissioners, the text 911 system only handles texts in English. Text only if it is not safe to call or if you are hearing impaired. When traveling in the tri-county area, please remember Palm Beach County has text to 911, but Miami-Dade does not.

Feeding South Florida can help you apply for government benefits, such as SNAP, TCA, Medicaid, and Florida KidCare. Clients who apply for benefits may shop the food pantry once a month. If food assistance is needed more frequently, clients are referred to partner agencies located within their zip code. New clients can access household items, such as dishes and toys, as available. Census Jobs

The U.S. Census Bureau is recruiting employees to assist with the 2020 Census count. The jobs are temporary, most lasting several weeks, and include census takers, recruiting assistants, office staff, and supervisory staff. Most require a valid driver's license, access to a vehicle or readily available public transportation, access to a computer with internet, and an email account. The largest number of openings are for Census takers which pays \$17.50 per hour in Broward County. To be eligible, you must be at least 18 years old, have a valid Social Security number, and be a U.S. citizen. Bilingual applicants are encouraged to apply, but all hires must be able to speak, read, and write in English. [Census jobs.](#)
