

## Independent Transportation Surtax Oversight Board

Dear County Administrator Cepero:

In furtherance of the Transportation Surtax Oversight Board's (Oversight Board) responsibilities enumerated in Chapter 31½-75(i)(1), County Code of Ordinances, please accept this formal transmittal approving, as to eligibility under Section 212.055(1), Florida Statutes, Broward County's proposed projects and expenditures detailed during the <u>Regular Agenda of the August 16, 2023, Oversight Board meeting</u>. Pursuant to Article V, Section 31½-75(i)(1)(a), of the Broward County Code of Ordinances, the Oversight Board approved as eligible per Florida Statutes Section 212.055(1):

• **Public Works Department**: Additional surtax expenditures in the amount of \$8.9M for Sheridan Street Capacity Expansion (FY2023 supplemental budget request)

In addition, proposed projects and proposed expenditures were detailed in staff's FY 2024 Budget Workshop presentation to the Oversight Board on August 16, 2023. The Oversight Board determined during the <u>Regular Agenda of the August 18, 2023, Oversight Board meeting</u>, that the FY 2024 proposed projects and proposed expenditures for the Public Works Department, Transportation Department, Aviation Department, MAP Administration, Office of the County Attorney, and Municipalities who participate in the surtax program, are eligible under Florida Statutes Section 212.055(1) after giving due consideration to the opinion of the Transportation Surtax General Counsel:

- Public Works Department: \$92.5M for Public Works projects, Capital Design and Construction.
- Transportation Department: \$128.5M for Transit Capital, \$36.4M for Transitways Capital, \$95.2M for Transit Infrastructure, \$70M for Regional Transportation Capital, \$113.1M transfer for Transit Operating, \$4.8M for Late Shift Connect and Micro-transit Pilots, and \$20.9M for the Municipal Community Shuttle Program.
- Aviation Department: \$167M for FLL Intermodal Center, 213.8M for FLL Automated People Mover.
- Office of the County Attorney: an additional Assistant County Attorney positions and a 5% increase for the existing four positions included in the Surtax Fund.
- MAP Administration: \$5.7M for 14 staff positions and recurring contractual obligations inclusive of the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization's Surtax Services Agreement.

• Municipal Projects: \$32.3M appropriated for Municipal Projects in FY 2024, although \$47.4M is programmed for municipal capital projects in FY 2024 using unexpended funds associated with the municipal component of the surtax program from prior years that will carry forward to FY 2024.

Additionally, the Oversight Board reviewed and approved, as eligible per Florida Statutes Section 212.055(1), the Five-Year Plans (FY2024-2028) for County and Municipal proposed projects and proposed expenditures and Municipal Projects:

- Public Works Department: \$362.5M for Public Works projects, capital Design and construction.
- Transportation Department: \$1.159.2B for Surtax Capital (Light Rail Transit, Bus Rapid Transit, Fixed-Route, High Frequency Buses, Paratransit Vehicles, Planning Studies, Transit Infrastructure) \$767.5M transfer for Transit Operating, \$14.3M for Late Shift Connect and Micro-transit Pilots, and \$111.2M for Municipal Community Shuttle Program (Existing & Expansion).
- Office of the County Attorney: an additional Assistant County Attorney positions and a 5% increase for the existing four positions included in the Surtax Fund.
- MAP Administration: \$30.1M for 14 staff positions and recurring contractual obligations inclusive of the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization's Surtax Services Agreement.
- Municipal Projects: \$150.5M appropriated in the County's budget although \$194M is programmed for the Municipal Project Five-Year Plan FY2024-2028.

Pursuant to Broward County Code of Ordinances, Article V, Section 31½ -75(j) "All projects and expenditures funded with Transportation Surtax proceeds shall be subject to the Oversight Board's review, critique, and assessment for the duration of the projects or expenditures. The Oversight Board shall issue reports on the performance of ongoing projects and shall provide recommendations to the Broward County Administrator and the County Commission for any proposed performance improvements." We believe it is conducive to effective *Project Oversight* contemplated by the ordinance, to establish a program management approach or tool to coordinate efforts involving the following major projects receiving Surtax funding, in the geographic vicinity of Port Everglades and the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport (FLL): Port By-Pass Road, FLL Intermodal Center (IMC) & Automated People Mover (APM), and Light Rail Transit (LRT) for the Airport/Seaport/Convention Center Corridor.

On behalf of my colleagues, we appreciate the opportunity to serve the community in our capacity and look forward to the County Commission's discussion at the Transportation Surtax Budget Workshop on August 29, 2023.

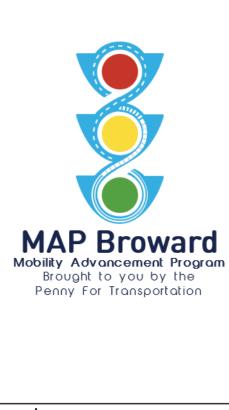
