On or about January 2, 2026, Broward County will submit a request to HUD for the release of Community Project Funding (CPF) (Project Grant No. B-24-CP-FL-0658) under Title 1 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1974, as amended, to undertake a project known as Sheridan Bridge Repair Project for the purpose of restoring load-bearing capacity, increasing vertical clearance through bridge jacking, performing necessary structural modifications, and ensuring continuous mobility and emergency access. The existing bridge will not be changed in size or capacity by more than 20 percent, and there would be no change in land use. The project is located at the Sheridan Street Bridge (Bridge No. 860155) over Florida's Turnpike in Broward County, Florida. The estimated total HUD funding amount for this project is \$4,000,000 and an estimated total project cost of \$12,700,000.

The activities proposed are categorically excluded under HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58 from National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements. An Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents the environmental determinations for this project is on file at Broward County's Highway & Bridge Maintenance Division and may be examined or copied weekdays 7 A.M to 5 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Broward County's Highway and Bridge Maintenance Division. All comments received by December 31, 2025 will be considered by the Broward County prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

Broward County certifies to HUD that Anh Ton, P.E., Certifying Officer, in his capacity as Director of Highway and Bridge Maintenance Division consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows Broward County to use HUD program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and Broward County's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of Broward County; (b) Broward County has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal

agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD's Atlanta Regional Office at Five Points Plaza Building, 40 Marietta Street, Atlanta GA, 30303-2806. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
