IV. **TAC Approval of Minutes for August 15, 2025

Minutes shall be updated to reflect that Commissioner Bell and Mr. De Castro were present at the August meeting.

Revised meeting minutes were approved unanimously.

VI. Presentations:

A. **2025 Resilient Broward Recommendations

Dr. Gregory Mount, Assistant Chief Resilience Officer, Broward County Public Works and Environmental Services Department

Dr. Mount gave an overview of the Broward County-wide Resilience Plan and introduced a County funded 50% cost share grant program designed to help implement these adaptation projects. Initial priority has been placed on shovel-ready culvert conveyance systems.

Grant program goals are to provide flood risk reduction and economic outcomes consistent with Resilience Plan recommendations, reduce flood depth by at least 6 inches, and provide 100-year flood protection for at least one structure per \$10,000 in project costs.

The County received 6 proposals for over \$11 million in total project costs. 5 proposals are being considered for:

- Cooper City, SW 49th St Culvert Replacement
- Hallandale Beach, Gulfstream Park Stormwater Pipe Improvement
- Sunrise, Basin 15 Culvert Upgrades
- Weston, Indian Trails Drainage District Culvert Addition
- Broward WWS, Replacement of S27 Salinity Control Structure

Staff are asking for recommendations from TAC to bring project list to the WAB for further consideration and movement to Board of County Commissioners for funding.

Motion was unanimously approved.

**There were three abstentions for the vote above. The abstentions were Badore, Zygnerski, and Dhulashia (Alternate for DeCastro). Forms are attached as Appendix A to these minutes.

B. Broward County Risk Assessment of Contaminated Sites

Amy Guilfoyle, NV5 and Dr. Maura Metheny, Moore Engineering

This project selected representative sites across Broward County and studies the impacts from common contaminants. This study also evaluates the effects of sea level rise on contaminated groundwater at selected sites.

Eight sites were chosen using historical data, and include former dry cleaners, gas stations, superfund sites, Port Everglades, and Broward County Mass Transit, with identified contaminants such as chlorinated solvents, petroleum, and free product impacts.

A combination of USGS MODFLOW and SEAWAT Models include rainfall and tidal data to evaluate sea level rise impacts to contaminated sites. The risk assessment model is being developed to further identify impacts. The study should be completed in early 2026.

C. Broward County Water Control Districts Future Needs Assessment: Flood Mitigation Evaluation and Drought Recharge Volume Analysis

Joseph Wilder, PE, and Tayyab Mehmood, Taylor Engineering

This two-yearlong project has evaluated four Water Control Districts in Broward (2, 3, 4, and Cocomar) to consider urbanization, sea level rise, and extreme weather impacts. The project assesses flood conditions to identify system vulnerabilities, drought conditions to estimate recharge requirements, and to develop and test mitigation strategies.

MIKE-SHE & MIKE HYDRO were used to evaluate both flood and drought conditions, building and refining previous models. Enhancements were made to drainage systems, control structures, local pump stations, irrigation, and groundwater pumping within the modeling. Overall, results reliably captured water levels throughout validation process.

A suite of adaptations, rather than one single solution, will be needed to improve future flood and drought conditions.

D. Broward County Rainy Season 2025 Year in Review

Dr. Rajendra Sishodia, Environmental Program Supervisor Broward County Public Works and Environmental Services Department

Dr. Sishodia provided updates on hurricane season, rainfall, high tides, and groundwater tables. Hurricane season has been average, with cooler August surface water temperatures possibly accounting for predictions to be adjusted from higher-than-average expected number of storms down to average.

Rainfall has been slightly lower than average, except for the month of September, and variable across the County and region. Rainfall has been more concentrated in afternoon storms than in previous years.

High tide levels are increasing year over year, with 75 flood days at Port Everglades in 2025. Document the Floods can be used to report flood observations by the public. Groundwater table levels are slightly lower than last year, likely due to decreased rainfall.
