It is recognized that most projects proposed will be conceptual and detailed specifications and calculations are not expected in your grant application. Projects will be considered for funding by the Broward County Water Advisory Board Technical Advisory Committee on August 18, 2023, pending final scheduling.

- M. Provides for timely implementation (5 points)
