

Broward County Transit (BCT) has added 209 fixed-route buses to our fleet including 12 electric buses. BCT continually updates our fleet with the latest technologies provide excellent service for our customers.

The fixed route buses travel between Broward, Miami-Dade and Palm Beach counties every day of the week, including holidays, connecting to Miami-Dade Transit, Palm Tran and Tri-Rail. The entire bus fleet is air-conditioned, wheelchair and scooter accessible, and includes bike racks.

Service Area: 410 square miles within Broward County.
